From the Pastor's Desk...

To say that 2020 has been a challenging year thus far is an understatement! Yet here we are, about to enter another new month, some 5 ½ months since so much of what we understood as normal, dramatically changed. During these months, I've heard and felt a deep sense of longing for a return, a return to what we viewed as normal, as routine. Not only has there been a deep sense of longing, I would also say I've heard of deep, deep grief because of this pandemic and the constraints it has put on us, on our normal, on our routine. We long for a return to what we knew, what we were familiar with and we grieve for the wide range of losses we've experienced. If you have felt this way, you are not alone...the more I talk with folks, the more I hear this expressed.

Typically, September signals a return to the fall schedule in the church...with Rally Day, God's Work Our Hands, Sunday school classes, choir and hand bell rehearsals, Men's Bible studies and Women's circles, and more. September 2020 will be different, we may long for and grieve that which we miss...in our everyday life, in our church life...yet we trust and hope that which we long for will return. It may not be the same and it is okay to grieve that possibility, yet hope remains.

Hope in the One who came and continues to come and shower grace and mercy upon us each and every day. Hope in God's Son, Jesus, who loves us unconditionally and promises that we are never ever alone. I trust that our longing and grieving during this time will flow into hope, the hope that Christ brings, hope of new life, new life beyond physical distancing and Covid, new life beyond scorching wildfires and raging hurricanes, new life beyond cancer and all other illnesses and diseases, new life beyond loneliness and isolation, life that leads to new life. As we may continue to experience longing and grief, I pray for deep and abiding peace and hope for your heart and mind. Let it be so, Amen.




