This time of year is a crucial one here at the ministry as one of our main supply drives takes place between now and the new year with our Gifts for Life program; churches, workplaces, and civic groups alike have assisted Life Saver Ministries in the past by allowing us to provide tags (like those pictured at right) that are then placed on a Christmas tree or display of the group's choosing for people to choose an item or two that they would like to purchase for the ministry. These items range from diapers to socks, shampoo and razors, and beyond depending on what our current inventory needs are. The main ways that we are able to provide thousands of items to families in need throughout the year is through this Gifts for Life program (running Thanksgiving through New Years), our Love for Life Fundraiser in which people give monetary donations to cover 100 pounds at a time bulk supply of needed items (running Valentine's Day through St. Patrick's Day), and our Bottles for Change Fundraiser (running Mother's Day through Father's Day) in which bottles of spare coins, cash and checks are collected from churches around our supporter territory.
