Poor in Spirit...

Matthew 5:3 "Blessed are the poor in spirit. for theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

A few weeks ago in LA, I had a chance to visit one of my friend's Sunday School classes. There I saw a little girl drawing a picture of Jesus. Her portrait consisted of Jesus floating in the air and opening His arms to the people of the world. There was a light illuminating Him from heaven and it looked as if He was ascending to it. In the picture, one particular part caught my attention. Instead of a heart-shaped drawing, which usually expresses love, the child drew an empty bowl in Jesus' chest. I asked the little girl about the bowl and she answered, "Jesus' heart is so big that it contains everything and accepts all kinds of people, even if they've been bad."

The meaning of being poor in spirit goes deeper than merely being humble and obedient. It proposes:

- emptiness
- acceptance
- fulfillment

We humbly put aside our preoccupied experiences and knowledge, and therefore accept others for who they are. Some of them might be strongly opinionated, self-centered, or even a know-it-all. Others might have a biased opinion about our life and faith, so it wounds us and makes us feel uncomfortable to spend time with them. But, by following the example of Jesus we have to respect the differences of others, who they are and their life experiences.

Many of you will remember the Gilmores from past visits to our church. They always have wonderful information to share and they have been so faithful in this ministry that God called them to.


Following Worship we will all be gathering at Marv and Kathie Toedtli's for a potluck picnic.
