# WARREN COUNTY (PEQUEST RIVER) MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY

## MINUTES October 15, 2014

Chairman Chamberlain called the regular meeting of the Warren County (Pequest River) Municipal Utilities Authority to order at 7:30 p.m. The meeting was held at the Authority's Administration building located at 199 Foul Rift Road, Belvidere, New Jersey.

Chairman Chamberlain led everyone in the Pledge of Allegiance and then read the Introductory Statement.

#### **CORRESPONDENCE**

Ms. Napolitani recapped the correspondence listed below.

- 11. A Notice of the White Township Zoning Board of Adjustment public hearing to be held on October 16, 2014, submitted by the attorney for an owner/applicant who is seeking preliminary and final site plan approval for a proposed dog grooming/kennel facility and residential construction on property located at 135 CR620.

## **CFO'S REPORT**

Bond Counsel contacted Mr. Houck to relay the good news that the State has consented to the Authority's request to be substituted as Trustee, in lieu of TD Bank, in connection with the Wastewater Revenue Junior Lien, Series 2002 and 2003 Bonds. Taking over the responsibility as paying agent for the loans saves the Authority a substantial amount of money.

In order to prepare the FY2015 budget, Mr. Houck said the FY2014 budget needed to be amended in terms of the Debt Service, because retiring the bonds was not included in the 2014 budget. He presented a resolution for the amendment of the FY2014 budget.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #14-45, amending the FY2014 budget by utilizing a fund balance of \$1,008,140 to pay off the bonds, thereby reducing Debt Service by that same amount. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

The FY2015 Budget reflects the FY2014 Budget amendment. As mentioned last meeting, with a few exceptions, the appropriations will remain flat. Those few exceptions show modest increases. Debt Service will decrease dramatically in 2015 because of the retirement of the bonds, but will increase dramatically in 2016. The money that would have been used for Debt Service will be placed in Capital Reserve. The recommendation is to approve the 2015 budget as presented. The State dramatically changed the format of the budget documents.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #14-46, for approval of the introduced FY2015 Annual Operating and Capital Budgets, and to certify the FY2015 Annual Budget, including all related schedules, and the FY2015 Capital Budget/Program as presented. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

By the November meeting, Mr. Houck will have the flow data for the last four base years. This information will determine the users' 2015 billing for sewage treatment.

Mr. Houck left the meeting.

## **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

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At approximately 7:40 p.m., Mr. Scott moved to adopt Resolution #14-47 to enter into executive session to discuss a contract matter. Ms. O'Connor seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

At approximated 7:55 p.m., Mr. Scott moved and Mr. Niece seconded to return to open session. All in favor, motion carried.

#### **GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT**

Mr. Tipton had nothing to report.

## **ENGINEER'S REPORT**

Mr. Donati's report was included in the agenda packets.

Washington Twp. WMP: Upon request, Mr. Donati submitted information to Finelli Consulting Engineers regarding our Oxford WWTP.

NJDOT Project: After speaking with Mr. Wauhop, Mr. Donati responded with initial contact information. He recommended the Authority keep updated on this project and inspect our interceptor line before the project begins. He was unsure if the Township of Oxford had been notified of this project.

Oxford WWTF Upgrade: Mr. Donati updated everyone on its status. Attached to his report was an updated schedule chart. Tomar submitted Payment Request #9, which CPE recommended for payment. There is still concern about the schedule.

A change order request for approximately \$18,000 has been submitted for unanticipated piping changes based on actual conditions at the site. Mr. Donati will have the documents for the Board's consideration at next month's meeting. Mr. Wauhop said the change order will be immediately offset by a \$2,800 credit, for allowing Tomar to utilize our decant tank instead of them having to spend money to bring in transportable tanks.

Axford Avenue Pump Station Rehab: Final payment is in for approval. The job went great.

Chairman Chamberlain had a question on correspondence #1. Mr. Tipton recommended tabling any action on the matter until he has time to review it.

#### AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report prior to the meeting.

Belvidere STP: Renovation of the #2 FST is complete and it is operational, so it can be used as a sludge thickener. This gives us additional sludge thickening capacity. The issue going forward is how to get the sludge down there without using the trash pump. We need to upgrade the VFD and some lighting, so, \$60,000 has been set aside in next year's capital budget.

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Oxford STP: There have been many problems with the standby generator at Warren Haven #1 Pump Station. The control board and stator were replaced. Mr. Wauhop asked CP Engineers to prepare a proposal for engineering work for drawings, so we can go out to bid on rehabbing Warren Haven #1 and/or #2 pump stations, similar to work done at the Axford Avenue pump station.

He recapped other maintenance items performed during the month at both plants.

General Business: We are still working on the foam issue at the Belvidere facility. Pictures of the foam were given to the operators' instructor at Hunterdon County Polytech for her comments. She asked for a sample of our mixed liquor.

Confined Space Entry: Mr. Wauhop ordered our own mask fit test adaptor because our equipment is different from the instructor's. Mr. Wauhop hopes to have the field test next Friday.

As discussed last meeting, the Township of Oxford seeks reimbursement for a bill they paid in error. The check for reimbursement is in tonight's bills list for approval.

Regarding the standby generator previously used at the Axford Avenue Pump Station, Mr. Wauhop informed the Board that it could be sold through a third-party on-line auction, or by posting it on our own website. He requested direction from the Board. The commissioners felt using an on-line auction would widen the exposure (audience). The Authority will need to pass a resolution beforehand.

Ms. Napolitani moved to sell the generator through the third-party on-line auction US Gov Bid. Mr. Deutsch seconded. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Wauhop suggested additional outside lighting for the parking lot at the Administration Building and the service building at Oxford. He has an electrician coming out to look at placing two additional lights on the Administration building.

## FINANCE (TREASURER)

Mr. Piazza explained the monthly financial reports in more detail. We are in good shape.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #14-48 (Certificate No. 339: \$60,977.63) be approved to pay all bills from the Operating Fund. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #14-49 (Certificate No. 347: \$363,687.55) be approved to pay all the bills from the Capital Improvements Fund. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

#### **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

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There was a brief discussion as to whether any action is needed concerning Tomar's request for an extension and our Force Majeure request to the NJDEP.

Chairman Chamberlain reminded everyone that the November meeting is on the second Wednesday of the month. Mr. Piazza stated he would be unable to attend the meeting.

## **NEW BUSINESS**

There was no new business.

## PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public present.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Scott moved and Ms. O'Connor seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:27 p.m.

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$ 2,939,599, Total Appropriations, including any Accumulated Deficit if any, of \$ 2,939,599 and Total Unrestricted Net Position utilized of \$0; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget as introduced reflects Total Capital Appropriations of \$8,305,000 and Total Unrestricted Net Position planned to be utilized as funding thereof, of \$0; and

WHEREAS, the schedule of rates, fees and other charges in effect will produce sufficient revenues, together with all other anticipated revenues to satisfy all obligations to the holders of bonds of the Authority, to meet operating expenses, capital outlays, debt service requirements, and to provide for such reserves, all as may be required by law, regulation or terms of contracts and agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget/Program, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:31-2, does not confer any authorization to raise or expend funds; rather it is a document to be used as part of the said Authority's planning and management objectives. Specific authorization to expend funds for the purposes described in this section of the budget, must be granted elsewhere; by bond resolution, by a project financing agreement, by resolution appropriating funds from the Renewal and Replacement Reserve or other means provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority, at an open public meeting held on October 15, 2014 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, and the Capital Budget/Program of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority for the fiscal year beginning, January 1, 2015 and ending, December 31, 2015 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the said Authority's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority will consider the Annual Budget and Capital Budget/Program for adoption on December 17, 2014.
