I Call to Order by Chair Bonjour

Bonjour called the meeting to order at 12:07 pm. A quorum of the board was present.

II Action on Agenda

Jorth moved and Schwamman seconded approval of the agenda. Approved unanimously.

III Action on Meeting Minutes

 Jorth moved and Daggett seconded approval of the meeting minutes as presented.

IV Review Membership Report

Albers shared the YTD membership report for FY 2026. Discussion ensued.

V Report/Action on Financial Matters

- Action on the Monthly Financials
 Albers reviewed the financial statements through August 31, 2025 and bill pay
 listing. Lorenz moved and Schwamman seconded approval of the financial
 statements and bill pay list as presented. Approved unanimously.
- Report on the Internal Audit by the Treasurer
 Albers reported that the 2024-25 internal audit by Hissem is concluded and shared
 his memo that will be presented at the upcoming RSAI Annual Meeting.

VI Mission Critical Actions/Updates

- Report from the August 14th RSAI Legislative Committee Meeting
 - Review RSAI 2026 Draft Legislative Priorities Buckton reviewed the discussion items from the legislative committee meeting and the resulting draft 2026 legislative priorities to be presented to the membership at the annual meeting. Discussion ensued, including additional concerns about implementation timelines in recent legislative actions. The group requested Buckton expand on the local control priority language to highlight the distraction immediate implementation of new legislation causes without rules or guidance, as well as the importance to include school leaders in development of those rules and guidance.
 - Action to establish a Workgroup to study the RSAI Mission, Vision, Values and Goals

Buckton shared the recommendation from the Legislative Committee that the Leadership Group establish a workgroup to study the Mission, Vision, Values and Goals. Lorenz, Bonjour and Schwamman volunteered to serve on that workgroup. Staff will pull the group together for discussion after the Annual Meeting.

Buckton reviewed the agenda for the upcoming Annual Meeting and responsibilities of the Leadership Group members. LG members were encouraged to invite their neighboring districts to attend. Discussion ensued.

- Update on Legislative Matters Interim Session Actions
 Buckton and Daughton walked through updates on various legislative matters,
 including: the DE Special Education Task Force, the DE Survey on a statewide
 Student Information Systems, the DE Proposed Iowa Uniform Allocation Plan, and
 ISFIS's Memo to the SBRC on UAB. The group also discussed staff shortages and
 sharing with legislators how they are addressing these staff shortages in ways other
 than promoting open positions on Teach Iowa and the implications for local districts
 and students.
- Update on TPRA Grant No update on TPRA at this meeting.
- Updates from Leadership Group Members (anything to share with the group?)
 Leadership group members shared updates and discussed other topics including:
 how to quantify the number of new rules/mandates and related appeals and the
 distraction this causes to the work of school leaders with students; the number of
 superintendents in lowa that are sharing at two or three districts; the growing
 shortage around principals; the lack of direct educational experience by staff at the
 DE and the impact that could have on developing rules and guidance; COSA data
 requests, and recent visits by Director Snow to the various AEA Superintendent
 Meetings.

VII Other Business

The group discussed a likely change to Leadership Group meeting dates for the upcoming cycle, away from the second Wednesday of the month to allow for those who serve on both RSAI and SAI leadership to have fewer conflicts. Staff will circulate some options for input.
