


























Brodard's Restaurant in about 1986.

Perhaps you were there during the war. Brodards dates back to 1948, and has since relocated to the Palace Hotel on Nguyen Hue. It is famous for ice cream and bakery goods. Our guys who started the original AFRS radio station at the Rex Hotel in 1962, used to be customers. [You can] see bicycles through the window--very few left in contemporary HCMC."
















