Our Little Free Library as you know is located in the church lounge and all books are free for the taking. We also accept books as donated.

The folks who come to get groceries at the food distribution of the Community Food Pantry are so pleased to be able to take a free book or two home for their children as well as themselves.

<u>A time for all ages to join together</u> and learn more about The Lord's Supper will be on Sunday morning at 9:15 on April 14 in Fellowship Hall. Just coincidentally we will be celebrating The Lord's Supper in worship that morning. There may be smells of freshly baked bread as you enter the church. The children may learn from the adults and the adults will learn from the children. We all learn differently and age appropriate learning will be offered.

<u>The last day of church school</u> before summer break will be on Pentecost, May 19. We will be r eturning to classes on the Sunday after Labor Day which is September 8. We would like to encourage our children to attend a Vacation Bible School that is offered near you.

In all of our classrooms there is posted a wall chart that shows the exit children and/or adults should use in exiting the building in case of an emergency. Children would be led from the building by their teachers and taken to the parking lot west (down the hill) to the Garris parking lot to meet their parents. When warm weather shows up we may take a trial run at doing this. Parents will be notified when we plan to do the trial run.

<u>Session has decided to form a Safety Task Force</u> which will develop guidelines for all to respond to any emergency. When their work is completed, it will be shared with the congregation.

- The Book of James -

Adult Class will begin a study of the book of James. This book is considered perhaps to be the most practical book in the Bible on practical Christian living. Due to its practical nature, this epistle has been compared to the Book of Proverbs as well as to the Sermon on the Mount. During the course of the five chapters of his letter we will encounter one essential teaching for approximately every two verses he writes.

James is wanting Christians to pause and check: what is genuine faith, and does my life show evidence of it? This study series offers a clear understanding of the challenges of everyday life and a practical focus on consistent God-honoring living.
