Awards Recipients to be Honored

This year's *Conservation Award* recipients are the Eagle Scouts of the Yucca Council of the Boy Scouts of America. Eagle Scouts of this Council have devoted over 1100 hours to projects at Rio Bosque, Feather Lake and Keystone Heritage Park. An eagle Scout candidate must plan, develop, and give leadership to a service project helpful to the community. Examples of these service projects have been removal of salt cedar from Feather Lake and the cleaning up of an old dump site at Rio Bosque.

Hugh Jameson is the recipient of the *Meritorious Service Award*. Hugh has served the Chapter in many ways over the years. He has held the position of Treasurer for the past five years, served as Field Trip Chairman, and has raised funds for the Chapter by his participation in Birdathons. Hugh is retiring this year as Treasurer, but we are sure he will continue to be an active participant in many Audubon activities.

The evening speaker will be **Jesse Granthum**, and the subject:
"Bird Conservation through Backyard Habitats"

Jesse Granthum has been with Audubon for 23 years, starting on the California Condor Recovery Program in 1980. In 1986 he moved to Texas to manage all of Audubon's lands along the Texas Coast, and the Sabal Palm Grove on the Rio Grande River. In 1990 he moved back to California with Audubon to manage all of their wetland sanctuaries and expand their sanctuary system. In 1998 he moved with Audubon to Mississippi to become the State Director, where he also managed a 2600 acre plantation. In 2002 he returned to Texas to become Director of Bird Conservation for the state.

New guided tours at the El Paso Zoo

Tours of Asia feature some of the rarest animals in the world
The Amur leopard is one of the rarest large animals in the world

Education staff and volunteers at the El Paso Zoo now offer guided tours every Saturday morning at 10am. The first in a series of new educational programs being planned for the coming year, features some of the rarest animals in the world including endangered Asian elephants, Sumatran orangutans, hooded cranes, Amur leopards and Indochinese tigers.

Tour tickets are available from the El Paso Zoological Society office located in the Administration building inside the zoo's entrance. The cost for the tour is \$3 for adults, \$2 for senior citizens and \$1 for children under 12 (free for children under 2). Zoo admission tickets are extra and cost \$4 for adults, \$3 for senior citizens and \$2 for children under 12 (free for children under 2).

Other new zoo programs being planned for the coming year include a series of lecture and tour luncheon programs presented by Curator of Education Rick LoBello in cooperation with the El Paso Zoological Society and Service Systems and Associates. Tickets for the program will be \$15 (\$11 for Zoological Society Members) and include the price of Admission. The programs will be presented in the Cisneros Paraje and followed by an optional short tour of the zoo. Reservations at least 72 hours in advance, 915-521-1871. More information, 521-1881.

"RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK"

At El Paso's Rio Bosque Wetlands Park, the landscape has changed dramatically since the wetlands were built there in 1997. So have the Park's birds. At our March meeting, John Sproul will give us a closer look at the Rio Bosque project the management philosophy, the changes in the Park's ecosystems, lessons the project has to offer, and the Park's fascinating birdlife.

John has been visiting Rio Bosque and studying its birds since 1980. Since 1999, he has managed the site as a Program Coordinator/Manager in the Center for Environmental Resource Management at UTEP.

John is also well-known to Audubon members for his work at Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary. Many of the restoration methods now in use at Rio Bosque have been applied for years at Feather Lake.

At Feather Lake

Our Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave. It is open 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays and 2 p.m. to dusk on Sundays. Admission is free. Fall brought two new bird species -- Steller's Jay and Rock Wren -- and raised the species total for our sanctuary to 195. When will the 200th species be seen and what will it be?

RIO BOSQUE WETLANDS PARK DAY AT THE BOSQUE 2003

The annual community open house at Rio Bosque Wetlands Park in El Paso's Mission Valley takes place Sat., February 8 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Educational displays will introduce the flora and fauna of the 372-acre park. Visitors can explore Rio Bosque at their own pace by walking an easy 1.5-mile nature trail. Knowledgeable guides will be stationed along the trail to point out details and answer questions. Longer (2.4-mile) guided tours are planned to begin at 10 a.m. and 12 Noon. Tents with tables and chairs will be available for picnicking, and restroom facilities will be provided. There will be a number of activities especially for kids, so bring the whole family!

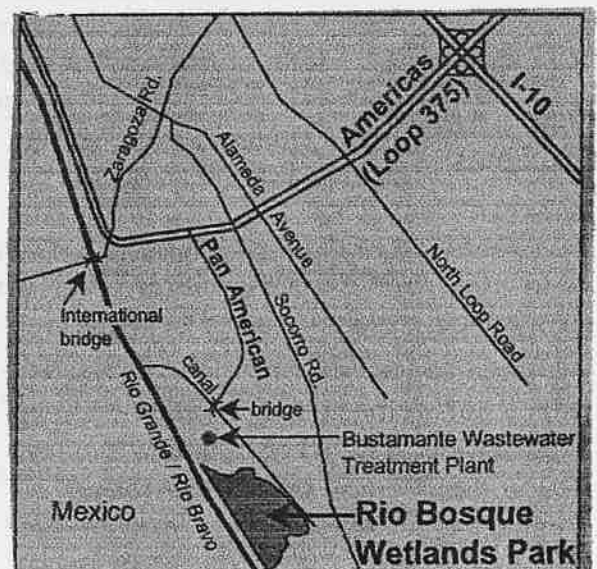
Parking is in the open field next to the Bustamante Wastewater Treatment Plant. From there, shuttle vans will take visitors to the Park.

Directions: from I-10, take Americas Ave. (Loop 375) to Pan American Dr., turn left onto Pan American and travel 1.5 miles to a concrete bridge over the Riverside Canal. Cross the bridge to the parking area.

ZOO / KEYSTONE

The first stop will be at the America's Aviary, located in the El Paso Zoo. This will allow close up looks that will help in understanding identification features. Then on to the Keystone Marsh to get close views of the birds located there, *Ring-billed Gulls, Mallards, Pied-billed Grebes, Common Moorhens, Killdeer, Greater Yellowlegs and Least Sandpiper.*

BIRDS OF HUECO TANKS

The class will tour the rocks and desert scrub of HTSHS for the birds that inhabit the area. *Gambel's Quail, Black-throated Sparrow, Verdin, Rock Wren, Canyon Towhee, Say's Phoebe* and many more.

MOUNTAIN BIRDS

We should get a number of higher elevation birds not found in the open desert. *White-throated Swift, Ladder-backed Woodpecker, Canyon and Bewick's Wren, Spotted Towhee, and Rufus-crowned Sparrow.*

WATER and WADING BIRD

Take in the sights of Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary, then over to Rio Bosque Wetlands Park. *Herons, Egrets, White-faced Ibis, Gadwalls, Green-winged Teal, and Northern Shoveler.*

DESERT BIRDS / BIRDS of PREY

A chance to see some of the birds that inhabit the desert scrub, *Cactus Wren, Pyrrhuloxia, Scaled Quail, and Curve-billed Thrasher.* Then out along Hawk Alley for *Northern Harrier, Red-tailed Hawk, Swainson's Hawk, American Kestrel and Turkey Vulture.* If time permits it will be on to the Fort Bliss Ponds.

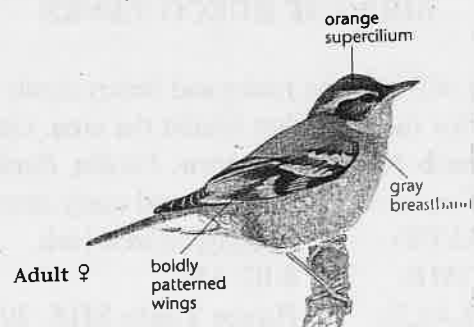

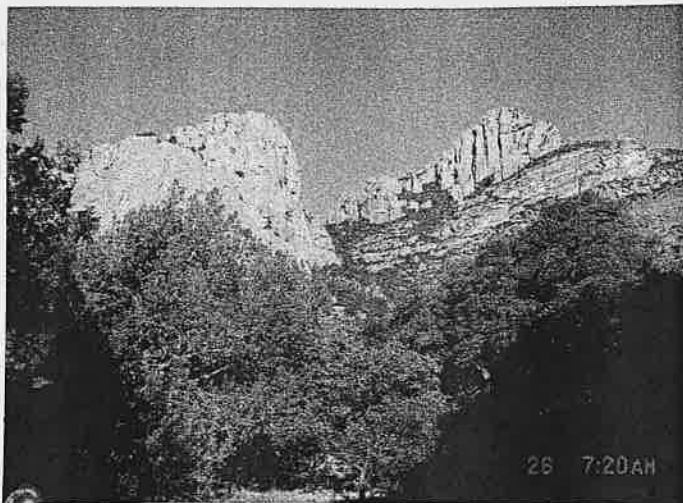
