#### **Update on Items from 2024 Minutes:**

#### 1) RFNow

RFNow has completed install of the main line to support residential fibre internet within our community. Internet service can now be booked with RFNow. #### 2) Swimming Area

New swimming buoys have been procured along with the required markings and can be installed for the 2025 season. We will need volunteers to install the Buoys and then remove them in the spring. Any volunteers?

#### 3) Snow Cleanup

Last year Residents on South end of Sunset Beach want to ensure snow is not piling up from cleaning the roads and hampering ability to enter their properties in the winter. We communicated the issue to Deboys and they attempted to keep the road clear for the full
