WELCOME TO CHRIST CHURCH

We extend a welcome to all visitors who are worshipping with us to-day. Christ Church is truly a beautiful edifice, erected and appointed to the Greater Glory of Almighty God. Herein, you find all things in their proper place; everything focused toward the Altar, the center of our worship. The windows in the Nave depict some of the fathers of the early Church, both in English and Latin. The Rood shows our Saviour, robed as a Priest, with the right hand in Blessing. The Chapel forms a quiet, restful place, where, before the Blessed Sacrament, one may kneel in supplication and reverence. We are proud of our worshipful Church and invite you to share in its benefit. Come in, rest, and pray apart from the world. Surely God is in His Holy Temple.

All who confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, have been baptized in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost, and are repentant of their sins and believe the Blessed Sacrament to be the true Body and Blood of Christ, are invited to receive the Sacrament of the Altar. We hope that you will enter fully into worship by joining in the prayers, responses, and hymns. Because our worship may be unfamiliar to those not raised in the Episcopal Church, feel free to ask the assistance of those around you in following and participating in the liturgy. If you are in search of a church home, we invite you to join us in worship, fellowship, and service. Please sign the guest register at the church entrance so we may have a record of your visit.

Restrooms are located in the Parish House and are accessible through the double doors by the pulpit, or by exiting the main doors and entering the Parish House by way of the side office door. A **Baby Changing Station** is located in the accessible bathroom in the Parish House. A **restroom for small children** is located in the nursery at the far end of the Parish House.



The Gesimas: This Sunday, we enter what the traditional Church calendar calls Gesimatiade. Gesimatiade is a transitional period between the joyful seasons of Christmastide and Epiphanytide to the penitential season of Lent. There are three Sundays in Gesimatiade: Septuagesima, Sexagesima, and Quinquagesima. The words are just Latin for 70, 60, and 50; Septuagesima is 70 days before Easter, and so on. Traditionally, the gesimas were used to get people ready for Lent. Violet vestments and altar hangings were used, the Gloria was suppressed, and there was a general tamping down of joyful hymns and musical offerings. This preparation helps to make Ash Wednesday feel less like an unwanted surprise coming out of the blue. The gesimas themselves were suppressed in the liturgical changes of the Roman Catholic Church in the mid-20th Century, and the Episcopal Church followed their lead. Here at Christ Church and at many other parishes, we mark the gesimas in our calendar so that we are mindful of the approach of Lent, but do not follow the other customs. Perhaps we should!
