Police Department

With school back in session, there needs to be a few reminders on school bus laws and the school speed limit zone.

SDCL: 32-32-6 Duty of motorists to slow or stop in obedience to amber or red signal--Exceptions--Violation as misdemeanor.

- The operator of a motor vehicle on a highway that has less than two lanes of travel in each direction or a private road approaching a school bus that has its amber warning lights flashing shall reduce the speed of the vehicle not to exceed fifteen miles per hour and proceed past the school bus with caution. The operator of a motor vehicle approaching a school bus that has its red signal lights flashing shall make a complete stop. The stopped vehicle shall be at least fifteen feet from the school bus and shall remain stopped until the flashing red signal lights are extinguished. A lane that is designated solely for the purpose of turning is not considered a lane of travel for purposes of this section.
- The operator of a motor vehicle on a highway providing two or more lanes of travel in each
 direction does not need to reduce the speed of the vehicle when approaching a school bus that
 is traveling in the opposite direction if the school bus has its amber warning lights flashing. The
 operator of a motor vehicle on a highway providing two or more lanes of travel in each
 direction does not need to stop when approaching a school bus that is traveling in the opposite
 direction even though the school bus is stopped and has its red signal lights flashing.
- The operator of a motor vehicle on a highway providing two or more lanes of travel in each direction approaching a school bus that is traveling in the same direction and has its amber warning lights flashing shall reduce the speed of the vehicle not to exceed fifteen miles per hour and proceed past the school bus with caution. The operator of a motor vehicle on a highway providing two or more lanes of travel in each direction shall make a complete stop when approaching a school bus traveling in the same direction if the school bus is stopped and its red signal lights are flashing.
- A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor with a \$132.50 fine.
- There is school zone from the intersection of Stage Stop Road and Sturgis Road to the intersection of Navajo Drive and Sturgis Road. The speed limit is a school zone and is in effect Monday through Friday from 7:00 A.M. to 8:00 A.M. and 2:30 P.M. to 3:30 P.M. The speed is lowered from 45 MPH to 35 MPH during the above listed times and days. Please be aware of your speed, there are children walking to and from school and loading onto their bus. This is not a new school zone and has been around for three years now. Please be aware of your speed.

SDCL 32-25-14: Speeding in school zone: A violation of this section is a Class 2 misdemeanor. Fines start at \$112.50 and go up to \$382.50.
