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INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Revere High School music program for 2018-19! This handbook is intended as a brief reference to provide parents with information on what to expect about Band and Choir activities that typically take place during the summer and the school year, along with guidelines for attendance, behavior, procedures, etc. The Revere Music Parents Association, with substantial input from the Band and Choir Directors, publishes this handbook. As things can change throughout the year, if there is any discrepancy between information in this handbook and instruction provided by the Music Directors, please note that the instruction from the Music Directors always takes precedence.

ATTENDANCE POLICY FOR ALL MUSIC GROUPS

Students who have to be absent from a performance must submit an excuse in writing two weeks prior to the performance. The Calendar of Events is published prior to the school year, so absences should not occur.

- a) Last minute absences due to illness should be accompanied by a doctor's excuse.
- b) Work is not an excused absence.
- c) Absence without a prior note or doctor's excuse may affect grades.

REVERE MUSIC PARENTS ASSOCIATION (RMPA)

The Revere Music Parents Association is made up of the parents of music students in Revere Local School District. RMPA is organized exclusively for the support of the Music Department of the Revere School district. We are a 501(c)(3) corporation and are self-funded separately from the school district.

RMPA meets on the first Tuesday of every month from August through May, except January, at 7:30pm and typically meet in Room 200 at Revere High School. Please join us! Just by having a music student, you are already a member of the RMPA, but we'd love to have you as an active member! We are a fun group who works hard to support Revere Music, but we need a LOT of volunteers to help us achieve our goals, so please see the Volunteer Form on the last page!

MARCHING BAND SEASON

Prior to First Day of School

Mini-Band Camp

Summer Band Camp kick offs with a "Mini-Camp" typically held two evenings in late May or early June. On the second evening, a meeting is held for parents of new band students to learn more about Band and RMPA. The purpose of "Mini-Camp" is to provide band students with their season music and allow them to get to know each other and meet their section leader. Students are encouraged to begin practicing their music right away!

Summer Sectionals

After Mini-Camp, each Section typically meets two or three times in June and/or July to begin practicing together. Section leaders communicate details on these meetings to the students.

Band Camp

Band Camp is an opportunity for the students to begin learning their music and marching basics, conduct drill charting, and rehearse for parades. Band Camp Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) can be found on the RMPA site.

Important Events

- Band Camp typically takes place the last three weeks of summer before school begins. In addition, there are generally a few rehearsals in late May or early June.
- Group and individual band pictures are taken during band camp.
- Band camp concludes with a Parent Preview Night.
- The Richfield Parade typically takes place on a Friday evening or Sunday afternoon in August.
- Tag Day typically takes place on the second Saturday in August before school begins.
- Students are expected to memorize their music and, as part of their band grade, must properly play ("check off") all of their music for the Band Directors or Field Commanders during band camp.

Camp Items

Medical Emergency Forms

Medical Emergency Forms are available on the RMPA website.

All students must submit a Medical Emergency Form the first day of camp. If this form is not on file, the student is not permitted to participate in camp.

Expenses

Band fees are due at the beginning of camp. These fees are for uniform upkeep and the purchase of personal apparel items.

Freshman fees include the “R” shirt and shorts, Dinkles (marching band shoes), gloves, socks, and hair bows.

Upperclassmen can order new shoes, “R” shirts, and shorts during band camp.

Uniforms

Students will be fitted for their uniform during the first week of camp. Uniforms are stored at the school by number – not by student name. It is each student's responsibility to remember his or her uniform number.

Dinkles, gloves, socks, and hair bows are the student's responsibility, and students must ensure they have these items for all games, competitions, etc.

Replacement gloves, socks, and hair bows are available for purchase any time during marching band season at the student's expense.

Percussionists do not wear gloves.

Color Guard / Auxiliary / Flag Squad

The Color Guard follows the same schedule as the band, with additional rehearsals as determined by the instructor.

Football Season / Competition Season / School in Session (First Trimester)

Sectionals

Percussion meets one evening a week at the high school through marching band season to practice as a unit.

Football Games (Student Responsibilities)

Pre-Game

- Wear “R” shirt during school to show band spirit.
- Wear “R” shirt and shorts under uniform for performance.
- Arrive at school at posted times for performance.
- Bring Dinkles, gloves, socks, and hair bows for the performance.
- Pickup uniform from Uniform Room.
- Dress for performance in designated rooms, not in the washrooms.
- Pass inspection by Uniform band parent.
- Get raincoats, if necessary.

Home Games

- Assemble outside the band room (main entrance turnaround).
- March to stadium.
- Perform pre-game selection.
- When dismissed from pre-game activities, assemble in assigned rows in designated stands.
- At the end of the second quarter, assemble for the halftime show.
- After the halftime show, return equipment to stands.
- Third quarter break:
 - Cookie Shack – Cookies and refreshments are provided by the RMPA for home and visiting band members.
 - Minuteman Café – Concessions available for purchase.
- No food or drink other than bottled water (provided by the RMPA) is permitted in the band seating area.
- Students must be back in the stands before the beginning of the fourth quarter. If late, students may lose their third quarter break privilege for the next game.
- If a student needs to use the bathroom at any point during the game activities (first, second, or fourth quarter), he or she must be accompanied by a chaperone.
- After the game, assemble and perform post-game routine.
 - March to flagpole for flag lowering ceremony.
 - March to band room.

Away Games

- Students are responsible for ensuring instruments are loaded in equipment trailer or on the bus – including harness, reed, mouthpiece, etc., where applicable.
- Band director dismisses students to the busses.
- Board assigned bus (attendance is taken by chaperones).
- Travel to away school. District bus guidelines must be followed.
- Disembark at away school in full uniform with everything needed for the performance when instructed by the band directors or chaperones.
- Assist equipment volunteers and chaperones in unloading instruments from the equipment trailer. Return empty cases to the equipment trailer.
- Assemble and march to stadium.
- Perform pre-game selection.
- When dismissed from pre-game activities, assemble in assigned rows in designated stands.
- At the end of the second quarter, assemble for the halftime show.
- After the halftime show, return equipment to stands.
- Third quarter break:
 - Some schools offer refreshments for visiting bands.
 - Concessions available for purchase.
- No food or drink other than bottled water (provided by RMPA) is permitted in the band seating area.
- Students must be back in the stands before the beginning of the fourth quarter. If late, students may lose their third quarter break privilege for the next game.
- After the game, assemble and perform post-game routine.
- March to busses.
- Pack instruments in cases and load in the equipment trailer or on bus.
- Board assigned bus (attendance is taken by chaperones).
- If a student needs to use the bathroom at any point during the game activities (first, second, or fourth quarter), they must be accompanied by a chaperone.
- Change and return uniform and raincoat as before mentioned.

Post-Game

- Change out of uniform and return to Uniform Room.
- Report any item that needs cleaning or repair.
- Uniform must be hung on original hanger.
- Number on hanger must be visible.
- Uniform must be zipped/buttoned.
- Return raincoats (if issued) to squad leader.
- Remove any personal items from the band room.
- Only band members and their parents are permitted in the building after the game. Friends must wait outside.

Parents Please Note: when picking up students after away games, do not park along the curb in the front circle drive for pickup. The buses need access to park there.

Marching Band Competitions

General Information

Marching Band Competitions have district (Local Event) and state (State Marching Band Finals) events. If a band earns a Superior rating at the district event, then they may perform at the state event. State events typically take place at several schools in Ohio over the course of two weekends in the fall.

A participant or group may perform for a rating or for comments only ("Festival Performance"), but must perform the required compositions.

Competition Classes

Bands are entered into classes based on the school enrollment for grades 10-12.

Class AA: 901+

Class A: 501-900*

Class B: 301-500

Class C: 300 and below

* Revere is Class A.

Scoring

Rating I: Superior

Rating II: Excellent

Student Responsibilities

Marching Band Competitions are a required component of a student's grade. It is extremely important that each student must attend all Competitions, with no exceptions. The schedule is distributed during the spring before Marching Band season, so adequate notice is given to plan to attend these Saturday events in the fall. Students must also attend and participate in rehearsals that are sometimes scheduled immediately before the Competitions.

Fall Marching Band Banquet

Each fall, a Marching Band Banquet is held in November after the football season is over. The banquet is held at a local banquet hall, and parents and family members are invited to attend.

Most students dress up for the occasion. A catered dinner is provided, followed by award presentations and dancing/socializing. Note that once arriving at the hall, students must remain in the building until they are ready to depart for the evening; no student can reenter the building once he or she leaves, and no loitering outside the building or in the parking lot is permitted.

Tickets for the banquet are sold on a cost basis. This is not a fundraising activity for RMPA; we simply require that attendees cover the actual cost of the food and banquet hall rental.

CONCERT BAND SEASON

Concert Season / Competition Season / School in Session (Second and Third Trimester)

Bands

Symphonic Winds Band / Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band

At the Director's discretion, concert band may consist of Wind Ensemble and Symphonic Band large group forums, with the Wind Ensemble for the more developed musicians, or alternatively one large Symphonic Winds Band.

Concert band allows students to review and improve basic instrumental technique through study and quality band literature. Students perform in large group forum and small group genre: woodwind choir, brass choir, and percussion ensemble.

Auditions for the high school concert ensembles are held at the beginning of the second trimester.

The Concert Band(s) typically participates in at least three concerts during the season, as well as the district OMEA Large Group Adjudicated Event. OMEA solo and ensembles are also held during Concert Band season.

Formal Attire

Students are assigned formal concert attire to keep at home and are to treat it with respect. Ladies are assigned a dress and are to wear practical, low-heeled shoes. Gentlemen are assigned a jacket, pants, bowtie, and cummerbund, and are to wear black socks and shoes (Dinkles are acceptable). Formal attire is returned in May. Replacement fees will be assessed if not returned or damaged.

Jazz Band

The Revere Jazz Band is a voluntary ensemble of instrumentalists selected by audition following marching band season. The ensemble studies and performs a variety of jazz literature.

PEP Band

The Revere PEP Band is a voluntary ensemble of instrumentalists that perform at all Revere High School varsity boys' home basketball games. Membership is open to all high school band members.

On home game nights, PEP Band meets at 6pm in the band room to rehearse, and then plays at games which typically end around 9-9:30pm. The uniform is the blue "R" shirt and jeans. Excused absences must be provided to the band director 24 hours prior to game call time.

A sign-up sheet is posted in the band room near the end of marching band season. Participation in PEP Band counts as one point towards Band Varsity Letters.

Pit Orchestra

The Revere Pit Orchestra is a voluntary ensemble of instrumentalists, consisting of professional musicians and RHS band students, who perform the music for RHS spring musicals based on an audition process. Pit Orchestra rehearsals are typically held February through April, initially on Sunday afternoons, and then after school during Tech Week and Dress Rehearsals (the last two weeks prior to the musical performances). Members of the Pit Orchestra must perform in all musical performances.

Honor Bands

In addition to RHS Concert Band participation, Revere Band Students who have interest may seek consideration in outside Honors Band opportunities. Each year, The University of Akron Bands host an honor band for high school band students as part of the Ohio Band Directors Conference. Selection is based on submission of audition recordings, typically due to the University by the end of October. Kent State hosts the Northeast Ohio All Star Honors Band. Selections are made after Band Director nominations are submitted. Students interested in Honors Band opportunities can find more information on the RMPA site and should discuss further with the RHS Director. Students are responsible for any auditions and associated fees.

External Orchestras

Those students with a strong interest in music may also want to consider participation in external orchestras or symphonies. Each year, several Revere Music students audition and are selected as members into the Cleveland Orchestra Youth Orchestra (COYO), Cleveland Youth Wind Symphony (CYWS), Akron Youth Symphony, and Canton Youth Symphony. Links providing further information on these music organizations, as well as other external music workshops and opportunities, are available on the RMPA site. Students are responsible for auditions and any associated fees.

Private Lessons

For students who wish to improve their musical skill & abilities through private lessons, a list of local private music instructors is provided on the Revere High School Band webpage. Students are responsible for arranging all private lessons and associated fees.

OMEA Competitions

OMEA Solo and Ensemble Contests

OMEA Solo and Ensemble Contest events feature individual music student performers (soloists) and small groups of performers (ensembles) that perform at a local district event at either the middle school or high school level.

Soloists and ensembles chose their own music within OMEA Guidelines. Middle school performers may choose any appropriate music that falls within the approved events. High school performers must perform music from a required list provide by OMEA.

Students who elect to participate in solo contests must prepare their solo themselves and pay for entrance fees and accompanist if needed. Revere Music staff accompanists may be assigned or a student may bring their own. If your selected solo literature is complex, you may want to consider making arrangements with a private pianist to accompany you. Your private music instructor should be able to recommend someone or you may wish to consider a music major from a local university. All OMEA rehearsals are after school. Rehearsals with Revere music staff typically include two 30 minute rehearsals, so anything requiring more rehearsal time should be handled by another accompanist.

Students may be assigned to ensembles, or they may form their own. Entrance fees for ensembles are paid for by the RMPA. (If an ensemble decides to drop out after fees are paid, the ensemble must reimburse the RMPA.)

High school students must provide their own transportation to the OMEA Solo and Ensemble contest. Per district policy, student drivers may not transport other students.

OMEA Large Group Competition

Large Group Adjudicated Events are for large ensembles (concert bands, choirs, and orchestras). These ensembles perform three prepared songs for a panel of adjudicators. If a large group earns a Superior rating at district, it may then perform at the state level.

Music Department Trip

Every two to three years the Band and Choir travel to a destination selected by the Directors with guidance from RMPA. Travel arrangements are made through local travel agencies with the goal to provide a well-rounded musical and educational experience for all students, with opportunities for both groups to perform and also to spend some time relaxing and sightseeing. Initial trip information, including estimated cost, is generally provided to parents and students at least six to 12 months before the planned trip to allow for saving and planning. Often, band fundraisers can help offset trip costs.

The most recent trips were to Phoenix, Arizona, during the 2013-2014 school year, and Orlando, Florida, during the 2016-17 school year. Info on past trips can be found on the RMPA site.

Spring Music Banquet

Near the end of each school year, a Spring Music Banquet is held to honor the achievements of both Band and Choir students throughout the year. The banquet is held at a local banquet hall, and parents and family members are invited to attend.

Most students dress up for the occasion. A catered dinner is provided, followed by award presentations and dancing/socializing. Note that once arriving at the hall, students must remain in the building until they are ready to depart for the evening; no student can reenter the building once he or she leaves, and no loitering outside the building or in the parking lot will be permitted.

Tickets for the banquet are sold on a cost basis. This is not a fundraising activity for RMPA; we simply require that attendees cover the actual cost of the food and banquet hall rental.

Varsity Letters

Varsity letter are for participation in activities around band and have no bearing on class letter grades. Class grades are an evaluation of your music skills. A varsity letter is a reflection of your hours of commitment given to the organization. Points are tracked and accumulated over the student's entire high school career, and Band varsity letters are awarded in May of the school year when the required amount of points are earned.

Total number points needed for musicians: 5.0 points.

Total numbers of points needed for color guard: 2.0 points.

How to earn points:

A Complete school year of participation (Marching and Concert)

1.0 Freshman year

1.0 Sophomore year

1.0 Junior year

1.0 Senior year

1.0 Section Leader during Marching Band

0.5 Squad Leader

1.0 Section Leader during Concert Season

1.0 Preparing and performing a solo at OMEA Adjudicated Event.

0.5 Being a member of a director-led ensemble at OMEA Adjudicated Event.

1.0 Being a member of a student-led ensemble at OMEA Adjudicated Event.

1.0 Taking private lessons each year of high school.

(You will submit a form to your teacher for verification.)

1.0 Perfect attendance at marching band rehearsals not during fifth period.
This is any dates scheduled starting the last week of July until school starts.
(Any absence that is excused are not applied, but must be properly documented.)

1.0 Perfect attendance at all performances starting with community day parades in August, up to and including graduation of the same year.
(Any absence that is excused are not applied, but must be properly documented.)

1.0 Member of an outside performing or music ensemble using your band instrument. (Youth Orchestras, Youth Wind Bands)

1.0 Member of the PEP Band (must attend 9 of 10 performances).

1.0 Member of the Jazz Band, when offered.

1.0 Submission of a completed application for Honor Bands.
(such as: OBDC, ASBDA, or All-State or All-Star bands)

2.0 Acceptance and participation in the Honor Band you applied for.

Memorial Day

The Marching Band participates in two local Memorial Day observances each year: The Richfield Memorial Day parade, and the Bath Township Memorial Day ceremony. Students gather at the High School in the morning and are bused to the two locations. Band uniforms are not worn for these events. These events are considered part of the students' grades in band and are required for all students to attend. They are excellent opportunities for our band to give back to the communities that support us.

CHOIR SEASON

School in Session (First, Second, and Third Trimester)

Symphonic Choir

The Revere High School Symphonic Choir is a choral organization for students to review basic choral technique and work to expand vocal production at a higher level. Music from all time periods is studied in preparation for performance and contests. An audition and interview with the director are required. Enrolment is limited to voicing requirements.

Men's Choir and Women's Choir / Concert Choir

The Revere Men's Choir and Women's Choir are choral organizations open to any student in grades 9-12. These are foundation-building groups with emphasis placed on basic choral technique and learning to sing and appreciate a variety of music from all style periods in music history. No audition is required. NOTE: In years when appropriate to the available voicing, the Men's and Women's Choirs are combined to form a single Concert Choir.

Competitions

OMEA Solo and Ensemble Contests

OMEA Solo and Ensemble Contest events feature individual music student performers (soloists) and small groups of performers (ensembles) that perform at a local district event at either the middle school or high school level.

Soloists and ensembles chose their own music within OMEA Guidelines. Middle school performers may choose any appropriate music that falls within the approved events. High school performers must perform music from a required list provide by OMEA.

Students who elect to participate in solo contests must prepare their solo themselves and pay for entrance fees and accompanist if needed. Revere Music staff accompanists may be assigned or a student may bring their own.

Students may be assigned to ensembles, or they may form their own. Entrance fees for ensembles are paid for by the RMPA. (If an ensemble decides to drop out after fees are paid, the ensemble must reimburse the RMPA.)

High school students must provide their own transportation to the OMEA Solo and Ensemble contest. Per district policy, student drivers may not transport other students.

OMEA Large Group Competition

Large Group Adjudicated Events are for large ensembles (concert bands, choirs, and orchestras). These ensembles perform three prepared songs for a panel of adjudicators. If a large group earns a Superior rating at district, it may then perform at the state level.

FUNDRAISING

The Revere Music Parents Association regularly hosts events to provide additional financial support the Revere Music Programs to continue the tradition of excellence of music within the Revere Local Schools District. A portion of all fundraising monies may be applied to the general Student Trip Account to reduce costs for all music students traveling on a Revere Music Department sponsored trip.

Student Trip Account

The Student Trip Account holds a portion of funds generated by RMPA fundraisers in which students are asked to participate. Approval by a simple majority vote of the membership present at a meeting is required to set the contribution level (if any) to the Student Trip Account for each such fundraiser. The percentage allocated to the Student Trip Account cannot exceed 90% of the net proceeds of a fundraiser, as 10% must always be allocated to the Uniform Replacement Fund.

Immediately prior to any Revere Music Department sponsored trip, all funds in the Student Trip Account (less \$100 set-aside to keep the account open) will be distributed equally as credits against the final trip invoices for all current Revere Music students traveling on that trip.

Funds in the Student Trip Account are in no sense associated with or the property of any individual student and cannot be transferred from one student to another, even if related, for any reason including a student being unable to participate in a specific trip. Student Trip Account funds cannot be used for other activities such as banquets, band camp fees, etc.

Fundraisers

Tag Day

Tag Day is the largest fundraising event for the Music Department. Held the second Saturday of August, money is raised through door-to-door fundraising, “tagging” neighbors for their monetary support, and leaving them with a schedule of band and choir events. All students in the band and choir are encouraged to participate.

Students register in teams of two. Sign-ups are during band and choir camp. Teams are encouraged to include a first-year student and a veteran. Each team is required to have a parent driver, even if your child is 18.

Revere Marching Band Invitational

The Revere Invitational is our second-largest fundraiser each year, and provides the Revere Music program with great exposure in our community and the surrounding areas. We typically host between eight and 15 bands, also drawing their family and friends to our home stadium. It is usually held the last Saturday in September.

Soup Supper / Bands In the Round

Bands In the Round is a concert held every November, consisting of show music and pep songs from season and includes all school bands from fifth grade through eighth grade, plus the Revere High School Marching Minutemen Band.

RMPA sponsors a Soup Supper in the high school cafeteria prior to the show. Local area restaurants donate the food, and RMPA volunteers staff the event.

Fruit Sale

The annual Fruit Sale starts at the beginning of October and runs through mid-November. Delivery of the fruit is the first Friday of December. Fruit can be sold by students or can be ordered via forms included in local publications throughout the sale period. Students are responsible for delivering any fruit they sell.

Minuteman Cafe

The Revere Minutemen Cafe is open for business at every Revere High Varsity Home Football Game. Proceeds from the concessions are a great support for the Revere Music Program. The success of our concession operations depends on the generosity of the Revere Music parents who give their time to coordinate and work the concession stands.

Fill the Band Trailer

The Revere Music Parents Association partners with FUNDrive to benefit the Revere Music Program and give back to the community by collecting a variety of items for donation.

RMPA and FUNDrive accepts clothing, comforters, blankets, towels, sheets, shoes, and any other cloth items. Even stained or torn items can be donated. Dishes and kitchenware, small toys and games, CDs, DVDs, and VHS tapes are all also accepted. Donations must be in tied bags or closed boxes, and will be reused, resold, or recycled. No books, furniture, mattresses, pillows, TVs, electronics, or electrical items of any kind.

Proceeds benefit the Revere Music Program, which helps fund the care and purchase of instruments, uniforms, and formalwear, buy props and music for performances, and assist students by paying for music-related trips. The Revere Music Program earns money based on the total weight of items collected.

All donations are tax deductible, and donation receipts are provided.

RMPA Volunteer Opportunities

It takes MANY volunteers to run a successful music program. Please check your area(s) of interest and return to any board member, the lockbox outside the music room, or mail to RMPA, P.O. Box 671, Bath, OH 44210

- _____ **Away Band Show Meals:** Coordinate and/or donate food for meals after practices held before band shows.
- _____ **Bands In the Round / Soup Supper:** Help with ticket sales, setup, serving and cleanup. This event is typically held in early November.
- _____ **Banquets:** Help banquet chair with setup, check-in, and cleanup during music banquets.
- _____ **Chaperones:** Chaperone marching band at all football games and events. Chaperones also needed for banquets, concert band and choir away-from-school events, and music department trips. Please note: All chaperones must be fingerprinted and background checked, with results on file at the Revere Board of Education.
- _____ **Choir Liaison:** Provide status reports on choir activities and solicit choir parent involvement.
- _____ **Color Guard Liaison:** Provide status reports on color guard activities and solicit color guard parent involvement.
- _____ **Middle School Band/Choir Liaison:** Provide status reports on middle school activities and solicit middle school parent involvement.
- _____ **Concessions:** Help staff the Minuteman Café concession stand during home football games and the Revere Invitational. Help also needed during OMEA Large Group District Contest at RHS and at other special events.
- _____ **Cookie Shack:** Bake cookies for distribution to bands during home football games, and/or help staff the shack.
- _____ **Equipment:** Help load/unload instruments and equipment for away games and band competitions.
- _____ **Equipment Trailer Drivers:** Someone with a truck and towing package that can pull the band equipment trailer to and from away games, competitions, etc. (Reimbursement for gas is provided.)
- _____ **Fruit Sale:** Help unload, organize and distribute fruit during fruit sale delivery.
- _____ **Hospitality:** Coordinate meals and snacks for special events such as parades and competitions; provide flowers for Senior Nights in the fall and spring, and floral decorations for the winter concert.
