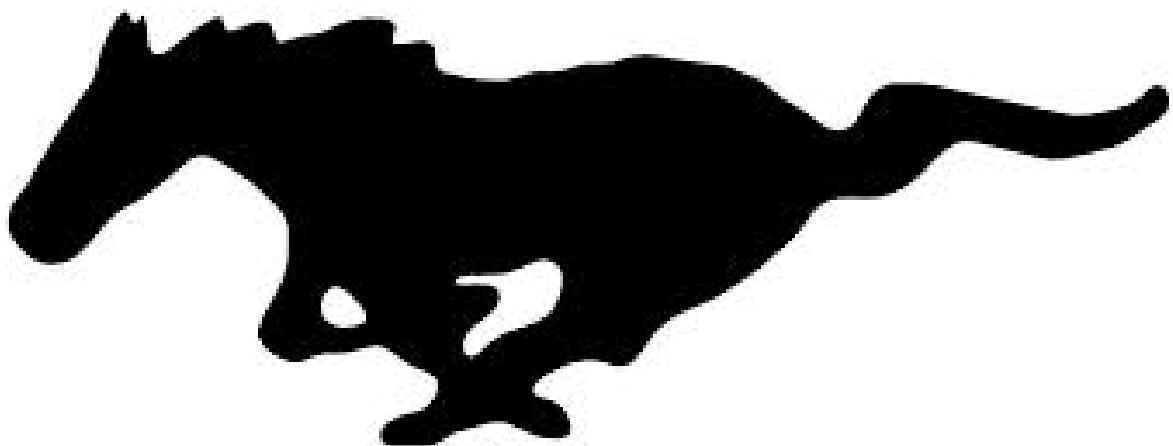
President's Message

What is the horsepower for the 2026 Ford Mustang lineup?

There are four available engines, depending on the Mustang model:



2026 Ford Mustang EcoBoost Fastback and Convertible features a 2.3L EcoBoost engine with 315 horsepower and 350 lb-ft of torque.

2026 Ford Mustang GT models feature a standard 5.0L Ti-VCT V8 engine with 480 horsepower and 415 lb-ft of torque.

2026 Ford Mustang GT models with the 5.0L Ti-VCT V8 engine and available active valve performance exhaust churn out 486 horsepower and 418 lb-ft of torque.

2026 Ford Mustang Dark Horse models are powered by a modified, naturally aspirated Gen-4 5.0L Coyote V8 engine kicking out 500 horsepower and 418 lb-ft of torque.
