TOWN OF MARBLE ORDINANCE TO APPROPRIATE SUMS OF MONEY

A ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY TO THE VARIOUS FUNDS AND SPENDING AGENCIES, IN THE AMOUNTS AND FOR THE PURPOSE AS SET FORTH BELOW, FOR THE TOWN OF MARBLE, COLORADO, FOR THE 1993 BUDGET YEAR AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has adopted the annual budget in accordance with the Local Government Budget Law, on November 4, 1992, and:

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees has made provision therein for revenues in an amount equal to or greater than the total proposed expenditures as set forth in said budget, and:

WHEREAS, it is not only required by law, but also necessary to appropriate the revenues provided in the budget to and for the purposes described below, so as not to impair the operations of the Town.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF MARBLE, COLORADO:

Section 1. That the following sums are hereby appropriated from the revenue of each fund, to each fund, for purposes stated:

General Fund	\$ 18,350
Streets & Bridges	7,500
Park Fund	\$ 5,620
Total Expenditures	\$ 31,470

Section 2. The Board of Trustees hereby finds and declares that an emergency exists, and that the passage of this ordinance with an effective date upon passage is necessary to the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, and safety of the Town of Marble and its citizens, because the revenue provided for in the Town's 1993 budget is necessary for the Town's peace, health and safety.

Section 3. This ordinance is effective upon passage by three-fourths of all members of the Board of Trustees.

ADOPTED, this fourth day of November, A.D. 1992 by a vote of 4 to 0 with one absent.
