¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"



Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem

Did you know that we are partners with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land? Amongst the nine congregations, four ministry sites and five educational institutions there is one very special church – Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem.

The Evangelical Lutheran Christmas Church is at the heart of both the modern-day bustling city of Bethlehem and the biblical story of the incarnation of Christ. Living in the location of God's incarnation, contextual and incarnational theology is an integral part of the lives of Christians in Bethlehem. Shaped by this identity, the Evangelical Lutheran Christmas Church in Bethlehem has long sought to empower local expressions of the gospel – in theology, in culture, in community, and in education.

There has been a continuous worship life in the sanctuary of Christmas Lutheran Church in Bethlehem since 1893. These Arab Lutheran Christians provide much needed respite from the chaos that surrounds them. Each Sunday worshippers from Bethlehem and around the world gather to give thanks to our God of hope.

CLC in Bethlehem shares its campus with the International Center of Bethlehem and has strong ties to the Dar al-Kalima Lutheran School and the Dar al-Kalima University College of Arts and Culture.

They are currently served by the Rev. Dr. Munther Isaac, who wears many hats in Palestine. Here is what he has to say about the war in Gaza:

"May we unite this Christmas in lighting a candle for Gaza, and particularly for the children of Gaza. This is beyond symbolism. Let us unite in prayer, and commit ourselves to the cause of ending this genocidal war. We cannot stop talking about Gaza. We cannot stop advocating. Most importantly, we will not lose our faith and hope in God and the goodness and justice of God."

It is amazing that the birthplace for our Prince of Peace is a place of constant violence. Pray for our fellow human beings who have to suffer so much.
