Thierry Haroun is a singer songwriter. He plays piano and guitar. But his real talent is his voice. It's powerful and singular. Well known musician and composer on the Gaspé Coast, he performed 16 of his songs at the Maximum Blues Festival in Carleton in 2002 and played in jam sessions around the coast over the years. But during the past two decades, he mainly dedicated his times to composition. He finally decided to release, with his folk-rock band The Gaspé Project, his debut EP this fall. His band is fuelled by four experienced musicians.

As a whole, The Gaspé Project musical adventure includes 19 original guitar songs and four written for piano that sing of the furious desire for liberty (You Run Like a Revolution), tenderness, tumultuous relationships, infidelity, the fight for civil rights of Blacks in Alabama in the 50's (There's Trouble Comin'), Bobby Sands' struggle in Northern Ireland (66 Days of Hunger), a tribute to truckers (Song for Jim), to topless dancers (You Don't Care), to bikers (Gasoline) and so forth.
