pastor's letter

Dear brothers & sisters in Christ,

One of the terms we often use at Christmas (birth of Christ) for Christ is Emmanuel which means "God with us." This year let us consider cultivating throughout the Advent Season and the Twelve Days of Christmas a deeper awareness of His blessings, especially the freedom to worship. We all know that in the midst of the joyful celebrations, many people are lacking in basic needs, are lonely, have lost loved ones, are forgotten, or are just plain sad, especially under the pressures of the past two years. In fact many Christians throughout history have not enjoyed the freedom to worship that we have.

For example, around December 13, Swedish and Norwegian Christians often celebrate the feast of the young Christian Martyr "Lucy", who lived in Sicily, in the Fourth Century. Born about 283, she was killed in 304 AD under the persecutions of the Roman emperor Diocletian because she had decided to devote her life to God and give all her possessions to the poor (in obedience to "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven." In Mark 10:21-23). Very little more is known about her. Her name means "light."

The oldest record of Santa Lucia's (Lucy's) story comes from the fifth-century book, Acts of the Martyrs. The only fact on which various accounts agree, is that a disappointed suitor accused Lucy of being a Christian. For this she was found guilty and executed. I wonder what evidence was given. Her generosity? Her refusal to marry an unbeliever? The oldest archaeological evidence comes from the Greek inscriptions from the Catacombs of St. John in Syracuse. In medieval accounts, Saint Lucy's eyes were gouged out prior to her execution. I ask myself, if had been accused of being a Christian, would there be enough evidence to convict me? How about you?

Traditionally Lucy's feast is held on the shortest day of the year, the Day of Santa Lucia when the family is awakened by the youngest girl in the family wearing a crown of candlelight and bringing warm freshly baked saffron rolls to each family member early in the morning. This "Festival of light" was important in the Lands of the Midnight Sun, near the Arctic Circle, where daylight is scarce in winter months.

In more recent times, the shortest day of the year many people still celebrate Santa Lucia, but a new tradition has started. "The Longest Night, a service of Consolation and Comfort" is when Christian churches have offered a worship service for those who are not looking forward to the holidays, are sad, lacking in basic needs, lonely, have lost loved ones, or are forgotten by them, especially under the pressures of the past year. My first two confirmation classes here in Fosston, conducted these services in 2018 & 2019.

When I worshipped and was a seminary student in Walker, Hope Lutheran Church conducted their first Service of Consolation. As expected, the gathering was very small. Among the few attendees was a young man, the father of six, who had recently lost his wife in a house fire. I asked what drew him to our service. "The name, "The Longest Night," he replied softly, "My nights are so long now. My friends ask me to go out for a beer, and I just can't, I feel the need to stay home with my kids". Each of his children came along with one of their friends and lit a candle in the service symbolizing the light for their mom, so dearly loved and missed. Each of his children and their friends sat and prayed together. They held hands and remembered not only their loss, but received the comfort that comes from the fellowship of the Communion of Saints who surrounded them with consolation.

Taking the time to grieve deeply, is healthy and strengthens us later. Only in darkness can we appreciate when we have light. Then can we rejoice in that which is good. In the darkness of troubles, we recognize the contrast and the goodness of light. Jesus said "I Am the Light of the World, in me there is no darkness (John 8: 12.) "Let your light so shine that others praise your heavenly Father because of you." (Matthew 5:16.)



It has come to our attention that there are cracks that have developed on some of the stops. This is the reason for the crackling sound that can be heard when it's played. While it still can be played by avoiding these stops at this point, it will become increasingly difficult to do so as time goes on.
