Aloha Kakou,

I want to take a moment to plug some upcoming events at Christ Lutheran Church and throughout Oahu. Most of them have to do with the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation, marked by Martin Luther's October 31, 1517 nailing of the 95 Theses to the Wittenberg Church Door.

These were ninety-five academic proposals for debate, regarding certain reforms of the medieval Roman Catholic Church, of which Dr Luther was a monk, priest and professor. He was probably a little naïve in the beginning, thinking they would remain in academic discussion. They didn't.

Martin Luther was also probably a little naïve, thinking that they would be readily accepted by Church leadership without any resistance. They weren't.

So, came the Reformation, in which Luther, foremost amongst many, insisted, less and less naively, that we humans are put right, made righteous, before God by grace alone (sola gratia) through faith alone (sola fide) by Christ alone (sola Christe). Here is meaning for our life together here on earth.

This justification by grace through faith is accomplished through the crucifixion of Jesus. It is channeled to us by the Means of Grace, by Word and sacrament, those sacraments being Baptism, the sacred ritual of initiation into the life of Christ in the Church, and Communion (also known as Eucharist), the sacred ritual of sustenance, or nourishment in bread and wine, body and blood of Christ.

A sacrament is defined by Command and Promise of Jesus. First, Jesus says, "Do this." A command. Then, he offers through this command, benefits of grace: forgiveness, life, and salvation. A promise.

Everything else we do flows from this simple yet profound elaboration of biblical, Christian and Lutheran faith and doctrine. Einfach, ja? Simple, yeah? And yet, so deep, divine and human at the same time.

Please take note of what is coming in late September and October. Like combining Christmas and Easter into one big, once-in-500-years celebration. I'm looking forward to it. Hoping you are, too.

CLC is once again participating in *Give Aloha*, Foodland's Annual Community Matching Gifts Program.

How It Works

From September 1-30, customers are invited to make donations up to \$249 (per organization, per person) to participating Hawaii non-profit organizations at checkout. Individuals must use their own Maika'i card to make a donation. Foodland and the Western Union Foundation will match a portion of each donation made with a Maika'i card.

How to Donate

At checkout, present your Maika'i card and inform the cashier that you would like to make a donation to **Christ Lutheran Church**. The name of our organization and the amount you donate will appear on your receipt. Donor names will <u>not</u> be released to our organization. You may donate up to \$249 per organization over the course of several store visits.

Are These Donations Tax Deductible?

Give Aloha donations are tax deductible to the full extent of the law. Please save your store receipt for tax purposes. Since your donation is made out to Foodland and they in turn cut a check to CLC, your tax credit would come from Foodland, not CLC.

How Will My Donation be Matched?

The actual matching gifts will be calculated at the end of the program. Organizations will receive 100% of all customer donations given to their organization, plus their % of Foodland and the Western Union Foundation's \$300,000 matching gift. The portion of the matching gift that each organization will receive will be based on the total dollar amount of customer donations designated to that organization as a % of all customer donations received for all organizations.
