Greetings to all,



I set in my office today and look out on a beautifully sunny day with the temperature close to 50°. I am also aware of a weather warning of a winter storm moving into the area over the weekend. At this point my mind tells me that could never happen. But common sense tells me it is January and winter storms happen.

We have been studying the Proverbs as our Bible study program and one thing that keeps coming up is the lack of common sense that there is. What we have been taught gets lost in the shuffle of information and we go with what we thing and not with what we know.

Wisdom has been given to us but we have lost the knowledge to do what must be done. We do not believe in what we know but we follow what we think. I know it storms in winter but I think it is too nice to do that.

As part of my daily devotions I receive an e-mail from Sapphires@hopeoftheworld.org. These devotions are written by Jonathan Cahn and today's message was entitled "Lead by the Spirit." It dealt with the reading from Genesis 24 which deals with the gathering of a bride for Isaac. It tells the story of the servant being sent to gather Rebekah as a bride for Isaac.

This tells a parallel story of God looking out for us. Abraham becomes a symbol of God as he sends his servant to gather a bride for his son. Think of God sending his servant (the Holy Spirit) to gather a bride (us) for his son (Jesus). This is the story lived out in the New Testament. The Holy Spirit is always trying to lead us back to Jesus as his bride.

If we will follow the Spirits leading we will always be led in the direction we are to go. As the bride of Christ we are to do all we can to be where Christ is. Wisdom tells us that! Those who follow in the teachings of the Bible are aware that we are to constantly be moving forward to be where Christ is. Knowledge is the moving in those direction we have been shown so we can do what we should be doing. Human nature is what moves us away from where we should be.

When we are moving in our humanness we are moving away from Christ. The Holy Spirit calls to us so we might change our direction and return to where we should be. The further away we get the harder it is to hear the Spirit, but the call never stops coming with the promise that if we will stop and listen we will be able to respond and change our direction to be headed back to Christ and the wedding that is to take place.

The more we listen and follow the calling of the Holy Spirit the closer we are to Christ and the life we should be living. May we all take a few minutes each day to check to see who is calling to us? Are we being lead closer to Christ or closer to our human nature?

Use your knowledge of the wisdom of God as your guide and I will see you at the wedding!

Leadership Team (Ad Board) Report....

The Team approved a donation of \$1,000 to the Milton Fire Company in recognition of their safe and efficient control and extinguishing of the November 26 fire while insuring the integrity of as much church property as possible. It will be accompanied by a letter of recognition and thanks for their diligence and caring.

Our property-casualty insurers have released \$500,000 toward our fire fund. We will probably put \$50,000 in our bank fire account in anticipation of first charges for work already done, with the other \$450,000 going to a special, separate fire account that we set up with our Hudock Moyer investors until we need to draw on it.

Insurance inspectors are still going through the debris field inside the church and have yet to look at the high sections where the fire was most evident. When that's done, we need to finish cleanup and the removal of wall and ceiling material. Following that, we can engage restoration, with the obvious first steps being to discern our ideas for "the new Bethany", to find architectural assistance (ideally, church-experienced) to help us design what we want, and to choose a general contractor for the rebuilding effort.

The Team unanimously voted to not repair Bethany's fabled Moller pipe organ, which was badly waterdamaged. What we will do for instrumentation in view of that loss will depend on what we envision for the restored church.

A 7-year-old boy has recently shown uncommon concern for the welfare of our congregation in the wake of the November fire, such that he did some special fundraising to help us. In addition to Bethany's expressions of deep appreciation for this young gentleman's supreme demonstration of heartfelt caring, he will be recognized by several arms of the local and northeastern Pennsylvania media.

Trustees Report...

It's that time of year! The Conference requires an annual Church Trustees Report, which has been completed and submitted. Part of the report includes the balances of our investments at the end of the year, so I'll take this opportunity to share the year end balances.

The following balances (rounded) are as of December 31:

- Hudock Capital Group (Pershing) \$595,561 an increase of \$13,499 from the last quarter We needed to transfer \$10,000 from this account for current expenses in December.
- Prudential Investments \$629,797 an increase of approximately \$24,880 from the last quarter this is our 'in lieu of flood insurance' account.
- Prudential Investments The Radenbush Trust \$92,888 an increase of a little over \$234 from last quarter.
- Prudential Investments \$8,313 an increase of \$159 from the last quarter.
- BYN Mellon The Butler Trust \$215,072 an increase of \$8,911 after the quarterly disbursement of funds which helps with current expenses.

Bethany Fire Update:

The Trustees and the Leadership Team have a lot of work ahead making important decisions regarding the future of Bethany. As most of you are aware, the insurance company has been busy combing through the debris in an attempt to determine a cause. That process will probably take a few more weeks. Because there will be large sums of money coming in from the insurance claim we are in the process of setting up a separate 'Fire Fund' account with Hudock Capital. To ensure funds are available on short notice to pay bills related to the fire, the account will be in short term investments. We will be able to transfer funds within a few days as needed.




