Pastor's Study Desk Notes



Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

Holy Trinity Sunday

Year C John 16:12-15

In the Name of the Father, and the Son and the Holy Spirit (+). I love how all of our Catholic Prayer *begins with* and *ends with* a declaration of the God we believe in: The Holy Trinity! We invoke God as a Divine Trinity, when we make the *sign of the cross* in the beginning, and we offer a doxology of praise to the Trinity as we close our prayers (sounding like the '*Glory Be to* the Father, Son & Holy Spirit.....'). But that is no surprise because God is our 'Alpha & Omega', our beginning and end, according to Book of Revelation (Rev 1:8, 21:6, 22:13).

Today gives us an opportunity to reflect upon the identity of our magnificent God (Our Awesome God, as the song goes!) God is a Blessed Communion of Three Persons-One in Being. I emphasize up front that our uniquely Christian teaching about God's identity as a Trinity has been divinely revealed to us. It took Jesus, to teach us the full identity of God. Jesus Himself revealed it to us through His own life ministry and word of instruction. Jesus mentions in multiple places the various Persons of the Holy Trinity. For example, Jesus mentions the full Trinity in His great commissioning of the apostles in Matthew 28:19, when Jesus declares, "Go, therefore, make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the *name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit*..." At the Last Supper, He mentions the Holy Spirit several times. For example, in today's gospel, Jesus says that He and the Father will send the Spirit upon them following His Ascension, "the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth" (Jn 16:7 &13). Of course Jesus often referred to the Father in His prayer, for example, in the actual Lord's Prayer (Matt 6:9-13 & Lk 11:2-4) and in what we heard back in Holy Week, "Father if it be your will, let this cup pass, but not my will, yours be done" Matt 26:39).

Those are specific words of His teaching emphasizing the Divine Persons, but there are also particular events in Jesus' life that showcase all three Persons at once. For example, at Jesus' baptism in Matt 3:16-17 we find the 'Voice of Father speaking and Holy Spirit as dove descending' and also at Jesus' transfiguration in Matt 17:5 we find again the 'Voice of the Father and the Holy Spirit as a shadowing cloud').

Perhaps the one place in the scriptures where Jesus most explicitly teaches the identity of the Holy Trinity is at the Last Supper, (a fitting time for full disclosure of His Identity, the night before He dies). Yet even then, Jesus warns that understanding the Trinity can be a steep intellectual climb, when He says to the apostles that, "I have much more to teach you, but you cannot bear it now....." (John 16:12). Again, today's gospel reading comes from that section of in depth Trinitarian Theology from Jesus, as He expressed it in chapters 13-17 of John's gospel.

We are not alone in struggling to conceptually grasp the Trinity, for we hear that the exasperated apostle Philip, pragmatically ask Jesus, "Master, show us the Father, and that will be enough for us" (Jn 14:8). Of course, Jesus asserts the unity of the Trinity by basically responding to Philip, "You *are* looking at Him!" The Father and Son are one-if you see one, you see the other! Wherever one is, they all are-Father, Son and Holy Spirit!

I always emphasize, though, about the Trinity, that it is so much more than any intellectual exercise of understanding – God's life is meant to be fully experienced by all of our selves- not just our minds, but God enters our hearts, souls and bodies. And even more, many a saint reminds us that it is better to experience the Holy Trinity's operation within us, than to be able to fully explain it. It is so much more to be desired, to pray in union with the Trinity and reflect its Love Manifest in our behavior and conduct, than to be able to perfectly explain it in a diagram or pictograph. Similar to the sentiment expressed by St Thomas A Kempis who wrote in his book "Imitation of Christ' that "It is better for Christians to experience compunction than to define it'. Baptism draws us into an experience of the life of Trinity, to be delighted in, rather than to be defined!

I love too, that the same Divine Trinity that the theology professor writes books about, is same Trinity blessing the 7-year old child as he/she kneels praying after receiving her/his First Communion! It is more important that the Trinity lives and prays in me, than that I can describe and explain the functions and relations among the Divine Persons. The Divine Trinity is just as present to me, when I pray making the sign of the cross, than when I write this column which is only a weak attempt at clarifying our Catholic teaching on the Trinity.

Gregory the Great says that "Love itself is a way of knowing" ('amor ipse notitia est' from his Homilies on Gospels, II, 27, 4: PL 76, 1207) Perhaps, it comes down to what people say when wise experience teaches us to identify anything—it is then, that you know it when you experience it! If so, I'd suggest that very experience is the Holy Spirit at work within you!

Diocesan Campaign to Build Priest Retirement Housing

You've probably heard already about this project in the Diocesan Annual Report, but the Bishop and Priest Council of the Diocese have decided to build a new 2 million dollar Retirement Complex of 4 units for future retired priests to rent, located behind the Carmel Home in Owensboro. Parishes have been presented with the *option* of either 1) simply paying an assessed share of the project or 2)submitting a top 10% donor list as well as hosting campaign receptions to fundraise for the Diocese. We've never been pressured before to turn over contributor names based on previous giving, to the Diocese. So, keeping things simple and clean, our parishes will just donate our Diocesan-assessed payment up front, to help the project, instead of turning over parishioner names and lists for the Diocese to solicit and campaign from. The parish as a whole, will itself just pay its portion to help with the construction of the four retired priest condominium units.

In summary, we are participating in this diocesan cause, but we will not be surrendering parishioner names to outside firms. Our good stewardship practice is not to sell mailing lists, or turn over confidential parishioner information to 3rd parties. Therefore, you should not be contacted by phone or home visit, by any paid diocesan solicitors. Please let me know if you are contacted. There will be periodic updates over time in the Diocesan WKC newspaper or email newsletter about the campaign's progress. Please pray about this. I know we all pray in thanksgiving & support for our 11 retired priests who have served Diocese!
