HISTORY OF PINETTA METHODIST CHURCH

(The following is a composite by Myrtle Wallace Feb. 2001 of two church histories - one by Mrs. Drew Sweat in 1940 and one by Mrs. Jewell Woodward in 1983. A complete copy of each history is located in Elmer's Genealogy Library, Madison, FL)

For several years prior to 1896 evangelistic and visiting preachers had held services in the Washington School House. Revival meetings had been conducted by the Reverends H. S. Miller, W.F.H. Roberts, J. L. Reynolds and others. A Sunday School was organized in the school house with Mr. Abraham Stephens as Superintendent and Mrs. Eliza Stephens, Mrs. Winifred Brannen and Mr. Charles Wolfe as Sunday School teachers. The efforts of these early Christian leaders resulted in an organized church.

We are indebted to Mrs. Rosalie Townsend for relating the following incident in connection with the early history of the church. On the night of August 31, 1886, Mr. and Mrs. Townsend and some friends attended preaching services in the Washington School house. The building was a log structure and had been "spliced" to accommodate the growing school. Mrs. Townsend and her husband were seated near the place where the newer part was joined to the original building. The service was disturbed by some noisy men and boys on the outside. The preacher asked John Prosser to step to the door and invite them to come inside, or request that they move farther away so that their merrymaking would not interfere with the services. Mr. Prosser did as instructed. Soon after he returned to his seat and the preacher continued his sermon the little school began to tremble. The trembling grew to distinct shaking, lights went out and horses on the outside became disturbed. The audience was naturally quite alarmed. Mrs. Townsend said to her husband, "Let's get out of here. I believe

those mean boys outside are jacking this house up with logs and will turn it over." The rest of the congregation was equally as disturbed. When Mr. And Mrs. Townsend got to the door, the building seemed to grow more steady, and as they hesitated about going outside, the preacher invited the crowd to be seated again, assuring them that they were only witnessing the work of the Lord. This, of course, was the farfelt results of the Charleston earthquake.

The Pinetta Methodist Church was originally Bethel Church. The first house of worship was erected on land given by John J. Prosser. It was built in 1896, two miles west of Pinetta on the Rocky Ford Road, in Madison County, Fla. Bethel Church was a one room structure of the following dimensions: length forty feet, width thirty feet and height fourteen feet. Some of the pastors who served the early Bethel Church were: G. W. Forrest, G. P. Parker, J. R. Crandall, G. S. Roberts and J. W. Austin. Bethel Church was a part of the Cherry Lake Charge.

The following were active in organizing the church: John J. Prosser, Lenora Prosser, Luther Edwards, Mary Edwards, Charles Wolfe, Mary Wolfe, Mrs. Winifred Brannen, Abraham Stephens, Eliza Stephens and W. F. Allen. Among the early additions to the Bethel Church were: Ida and Emma Wolfe, Julia Rykard, Chandler, Cary and Theo Prosser; Sarah, Minnie, Orvel and Joe Browning; Maggie, Alice and Lenora Johnson; Mae, Della, Bunnie, Sally and Effie Edwards; Mary and Davis Welch; Rufus and Vassar Allen; Rozza Morrow, Florida Waring, Jim Harrell and Louise Cowart.

Some of the charter members of Bethel Church were: The W. F. Allen family, the Dr. G. W. Barnard family, the John Prosser family, the Luther Edwards family and the John Jenkins family.

The congregation was moved to Pinetta in 1905 and became the nucleus of the Pinetta Methodist Episcopal Church South, affiliated with what was known as Madison Circuit, later called East Madison Circuit. A recorded deed, dated October 30, 1905, states that John and Mary Cowart deeded a plot of land to J. L. Edwards, W. V. Corbett and J. P. Kinsey as trustees of the newly formed church. In December, 1905, the Bethel church building was moved a distance of two miles to Pinetta and located about two hundred yards east of the Georgia and Florida Railroad. The following men were active in moving the church: Dr. J. P. Kinsey, Luther Edwards, R. R. Connell, Charlie Terry, W. H. Corbett and W. F. Allen. Reverend W. J. Gray was pastor and J. E. Wilson was presiding elder when the church was moved. Four of the first names on record were received by certificate, Jan. 14, 1906. These were Shadrick L. Zipperer, Mary E. Zipperer, Junius P. Kinsey and Effie G. Kinsey. That same year the following children were baptized into the Church: Cary and Mary Terry, Pearl, Grace and Reuben Connell and Gladys May Corbett.

Mrs. Q. H. Warren served as leader of the Children's Missionary Society over a period of years. Mrs. J. L. Sims, Jr. and Mrs. R. M. Allen have served as efficient presidents in the Woman's Missionary Society. Among the most active Sunday School teachers we would list: Mr. Q. H. Warren, Mrs. J. L. Sims, Jr., Mrs. W. J. Woodward, Dr. J. P. Kinsey, Mr. and Mrs. R. M. Allen, Mrs. Moses Leslie and Mrs. A. L. Leslie. Mr. Charlie Terry served as Sunday School superintendent for a short while. Mr. R. R. Connell succeeded him and served about twenty years. He was followed by Q. H. Warren, who held the office for about seven years. Mr. Warren's successor was Dr. J.

P. Kinsey. Mary Leslie Allen, Lena Belle Warren and Mr. And Mrs. W. B. Kinsey are the ones who have held the office of Secretary and Treasurer of the Sunday School. Among our stewards are: R. M. Allen, Dr. J. P. Kinsey, J. P. Hammock, W. F. Buchanan and J. T. Woodward.

In 1936, during the pastorate of A. A. Godfrey, the State Road Department required the church site as a part of the right-of-way for a new highway. The following bargain was made and executed. The church agreed to give its land to the State, and the Board of County Commissioners bought a lot from Mr. R. R. Connell for a new church site. This lot is about two hundred yards southeast of the second location of the church. The church bought a building from the Church of Christ, and the two buildings were moved by the State Road Department to the new location in November 1936. The Church of Christ building was annexed at the rear of the original Methodist building and divided into rooms for Sunday School Classes. This was a more desirable location, for the church now faced the new paved highway, and the larger lot provided ample parking space.

At some time during this period, Jennings had been added to the East Madison Circuit, making it a five-point charge. The charge was rearranged, and Pinetta and Hanson became affiliated, with James Gaylor as pastor of the two churches. This brought about the need of a new parsonage, which was made possible by the generous gift of George and Hilda King. Two acres were deeded by them to the church, May 1954, and by 1955 construction on the new parsonage was begun. The association with Hanson lasted only a year, at which time we became a full time church, with two preaching services every Sunday.

During the early 1960's a building fund was started under the leadership of Reverend W. D. Hicks. In June, 1963, Reverend Paul Swisher

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was sent to Pinetta. From the very beginning of his ministry the plans began to take shape and in a matter of months the new building was completed. The dedication ceremony was held the following year by the new pastor, Reverend Neil Vause. The mortgage was paid in full within ten years.

For the next ten years we remained a station church. In 1972, during the second year of Logan Whalen's ministry, we were joined temporarily with Cherry Lake, but after a year this union was terminated and we were back on our own once again. In 1980, with Bill Rub as pastor we became affiliated with Hickory Grove, and to this date have shared pastors.

Madison County Prior To The War Between The States...

*Article by Carlton **Smith** taken from Madison County Jaycees First Annual Tobacco Queen Festival program dated 3 August 1963.*

John C. **McGehee**, the first person to operate a steam saw mill in the county, can be credited for the manufacture of the high quality lumber used in the oldest homes seen standing in the county today. A few other mills, but with a smaller capacity, also operated during the 1850's, such as, Andrew I. **Charles**, Sylvester **Hunter**, **Dickinson & Sutton**, Wm. M. **Thomas** and Joseph B. **Watts**.

It was during the 1850's that more palatial homes were built than any decade in the history of the county. "Peachy Orchard", the home of Major Thomas **Livingston**; "Oakly Woods", the home of Samuel B. **Thomas**; "The Abbey", the home of John B. **Lipscomb**; and "Cheulotah", the magnificent home of Judge John C. **McGehee**. Of course there were other fine homes which were built during this period, but if they were known by a name, that has been lost. However, it is known that Benjamin **Wardlaw**, Gen. Waddy **Thompson**, a Minister to Mexico during the Polk administration, Col. Carraway **Smith**, William **Livingston**, Richard J. **Mays**, Capt. Hardy H. **Griffin**, Louis M. **Moseley**, Benj. **Waller** and Isaac **Bunting** all owned places of regal splendor.

COMMUNITY SETTLEMENTS

Community settlements throughout the county began about the time the town of Madison was formed. Before this, we know that such settlements as San Pedro and Hickstown existed. Added to these were West Hill, Overstreet, and Townsend to later become absorbed by Cherry Lake which was settled in 1836. Among the first settlers to come to this community were Lucius **Church**, James L. **Wyche**, David **Townsend**, Benjamin **Sutton**, W. W. **Hankins**, the **Dickinsons**, the **Frinks**, **Coffees** and **McCalls**.

Fort Hamilton, Stillipica, and Stockton became Moseley Hall. Among the first in-

habitants were Samuel J. **Perry**, Vans **Randall**, John L. **Miller**, John C. **McGehee**, Archibald **Fair**, the **Cokers**, the **Carters**, the **Cruces**, **Sheffields**, **Tutens**, **Baileys**, **Carltons**, **McDonalds**, and others.

Clifton had been settled by the well known Richard Johnson **Mays**, Henry **Dewey**, Rev. John **Gramling**, Harrison **Christian**, Farnell **Drew** and other families such as the **Bonds**, **Hines**, **Vanns**, et al...all became a part of Hamburg which had as its earlier settlers Adam **Rykard**, Joseph **Flowers**, Joseph B. **Watts**, George W. **Paul**, Daniel **Burnett**, William **Sevor**, William L. **Tooke**, the **Gastons**, the **Hintons**, the **Hugheys**, **Lopers**, **Pridgeons**, **Redds**, **Vanns**, **Overstreets**, **Harrells**, and others.

About this period what became the most prominent of all began to show signs of growth --Sandy Ford. This will be dealt with later.

Hickory Grove was settled by Wm. J. **Bevan**, Robert **Buchanan**, Andrew **Gramling**, Thomas **Langford**, Silas **Overstreet** and such families as the **McCulloughs**, **McLeods**, **Davis**, **Johnsons** and **Ambrose**.

Norton Creek, now known as Lee, was settled by the **Sullivans**, **Blantons**, **Webbs**, **Phillips**, **Williams**, **McMullens**, **Browns**, **Hicks**, **Malones**, **McClammas** and others. Hopewell, the first settlers were the **Albrittons**, **Foxs**, **Harris**, **Hills**, **Laniers**, **Mathers**, **Raines**, **Blackwells**, **Sayers**, **Perrys** and others.

Sirmons or Ebb are later settlements which sprang from Moseley Hall. Winquepin sprang from Norton about the time Lee was formed.

Pinetta, Hanson, Oak Grove, were a part of Mt. Horeb community. Among the first families to settle there were the **Cowarts**, **Washingtons**, **Hornes**, **Johnsons**, **Moody's**, **Starlings**, **Arnolds**, **Blairs**, **Coodys**, **Goldens**, **Hendersons**, **Hollingsworths**, **McLeods**, **Prossers**, **Terrys**, **Twiggs**, **Wisembakers**,

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Zipperers, etc.

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The Harmony Community which includes what is known today as Friendship, Wildcat, Eridu, and Walker were settled by the **Arnolds, Brannens, Bishops, Blantons, Baileys, Eakins, Goodmans, Maddoxs, Mozingos, Morgans, McLeods, Sheffields, Campbells, Fletchers, Spradleys, Thigpens**, et al.

THE STORY OF SANDY FORD AND STATION No. 5 BEFORE THE CIVIL WAR

Almost in the center of District No. 5 is the present town of Greenville. The district lies between Jefferson County on the west, the marshy Hickstown on the east, north to the Georgia line and South to Garbett's Crossing, an area nearly eight miles square.

Just who was the first white man to settle in the present town is not known. Indians lived in and near there long before the "pale face" invaded their domain. We know that at least part of the present city park was once the site of a Mikisuki tribe of Indians. Tradition tells us that it was there where Tokose **Emathia** or John **Hicks**, the most famous of the Indian Chiefs to live in Madison County, wooed the maiden princess that became his squaw and "the First Lady of Hickstown" where they lived.

Among the first planters to come and settle in the district near Greenville were the **Hinseys, Andersons, Lewis, Hamptons, Slaughters, Sistrunks, Cones, Cokers, Pattersons**, and others.

Richard **Harrison**, who died in 1854, is said to have been the largest planter of his day in that section. His estate was valued at more than one hundred thousand dollars at the time of his death. The **Pattersons** were there during the time John **Hicks** and his warring tribe of Redskins ruled the nearby swamps and dense hammocks.

Fort Vose was located about four miles

northwest of Lamont, Fort Jones was located on the east bank of the Aucilla northeast of the present village of that name, and Fort Hamilton was located north of Sirmans. These forts had been erected for the protection of the scattered white settlers against the marauding attacks of John **Hicks'** scalpers. On one occasion while on their way to one of the forts to seek safety, the Indians captured and scalped several members of the **Patterson** family. This horrible outrage occurred near what is now known as the Battle Pond. At this pond occurred in 1836 a battle between the few brave militia settlers commanded by General William J. **Bailey** and the Indians. Several members of the **Gillis** family lost their lives during this fight.

Undaunted by hardships and privations which confronted the pioneers, immigration continued. In 1836, the Indians massacred Joe **Gill** and his wife Anna a few miles northeast of Greenville near a lake which is known today as Joanna—a favorite retreat for many fisherman. This atrocity occurred soon after Captain Andrew J. **Lea**, with a group of civilians, (most of whom had served in the Militia earlier) defeated the Indians in the battle of Cliff's Hammock. Captain **Lea**, and his band of brave followers were again assembled and lost no time in picking up the trail of their retreating enemy. The Indians, about thirty five in number, camped one night at their old village site in what is now the town of Greenville. Captain **Lea** and his pursuers found live coals left by their enemy which indicated they were not far behind them. (The Indians were later overtaken and all but a few were killed.)

By 1845 are found such families as Captain Hardy **Griffin** (1795-1864), Andrew Y. **Hampton** (1806-1870), Orin E. **Sullivan** (1822-1876), Dr. Jeremiah D. **Reid** (1802--1856), Dr. Whitson J. **Hines** (1811-1875), Joel W. **Redding** (1822-1885), Farnell **Drew** (1804-1848), and Joseph **Flowers** (1790-1876). About this time or shortly afterwards came David **Sistrunk**, the **Sanders**, the **Waller**s, **Marshall**s, **Lintons**, **Bryants**,

Bishops, and **Simpkins** from South Carolina. Fountain and Spencer **Cone** came from North Carolina and so did many others whose names are found today in and around Greenville.

Captain Hardy **Griffin** was probably the largest land owner in his day in that section of Madison County. His real estate holdings comprised over twenty thousand acres in one single tract. In 1852, just east of the Aucilla River and about one half mile south of the present Seaboard railroad stood his residence in regal splendor. It faced the old St. Augustine Road and it has been said that Captain **Griffin's** home was a favorite stopping off place of many who traveled in the old stage coaches from Cowford (now Jacksonville), to Tallahassee and other points beyond. The Aucilla river just west of his house was crossed by a ferry operated by John **McManus**. The **McManus** home was not far from Pettis Spring (later known as Holland Park) as it was from this spring that he got his water supply.

By 1854 sufficient numbers had settled in and around the present town of Greenville to warrant a post office. Up until this time the nearest post office on the north was Gum Swamp, on the west was Bailey's Mill, on the south was Mosely Hall and on the east was Madison. So on February 24, 1854 the first post office, known as Sandy Ford, with Samuel **Williams** as Postmaster, was opened for business.

The first home of any consequence to be erected on Sandy Ford was that of Mr. William **Footman**. This house stands today as evidence of the fine quality of materials and workmanship used in the days when most of Madison County was vast forest of virgin long leaf pine. The first store to be erected in the town was by Willis **Harris** in 1859, a native of Albany, Georgia. The same year Dr. **Whitlock** built his home, it being the second in the town and in the same year he built the first drug

store. The first church known as old Shilo, was built by Captain Hardy **Griffin**, A. Y. **Hampton** and Mrs. Sallie **Lamb**. Completed in 1856 this house of worship had, as most churches of the day, a section or balcony in which the slaves could worship. The first minister to serve this church was the Rev. W. L. **Cooper**, of Thomasville, Georgia. Since then other Baptist churches have been built in the town.

In 1855 the actual construction of the much talked of railroad from Jacksonville to Pensacola began. Counties through which the railroad passed had sold bonds to help defray the cost of construction. With all the surveys completed, construction of the fills and many grades were given out by contract. By the summer of 1859, one could "ride the cars from Madison to Tallahassee." The schedule required about four hours time.

When the last spike had been driven and everything in readiness and awaiting the arrival of the "iron horse", a big celebration was held. People came from miles around, in wagons, buggies, horseback, and many walked. It was at this celebration that the name of Station 5 was given the Railway office, as it was the fifth one east of Tallahassee. (This name continued for several years, the post office continued as Sandy Ford until April 2, 1871, when the name was changed to conform with that of the town—Greenville.)

On the occasion of the first arrival of the "iron horse" the little village was well prepared for the exciting event. There were long tables laden with barbeque and other delectable foods of the day to satisfy those with sharp appetites. Usually in most gatherings of this sort a leading citizen would be called upon to speak and this event proved no exception. Columbus B. **Smith**, a leading attorney of Madison and well known Baptist minister, 'arose to the occasion' and "dreamed and saw great visions" for the community's growth, prosperity and future welfare. There, too, were the old fiddlers. They rent the air with such fine arid familiar tunes as "Cotton-eyed Joe," "Sallie Goodwin," "Hell after the Yearling,"

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"Leather Breeches," "Shear-em", and other melodies of the day that the young at heart might "tip a light fantastic toe" in a delightful and beautiful square dance.

ROADS

With the opening of new communities and post offices in Madison County, new roads had to be built. It is uncertain which road was the first to be constructed after the county was created. We know river boats plied the Suwannee as far North as the present highway 90. We know, too, that a road entered the county from the ferry landing on the Suwannee and ran in a westerly direction to pass the lime kiln at Norton, a locality we know today as Lee. Thence it ran near the present Macedonia Baptist Church and entered the present city of Madison where Base Street is now located. This road continued in a westerly direction and passed just North of the Carraway **Smith** home at Champaign. Then onward by the **Simpkins** Farm, Greenville and entered the old St. Augustine Road and crossed the Aucilla River south of the present site of Highway 90, at a ferry, operated by John **McManus**.

In 1845 when the Board of County Commissions was constituted, road building became greatly accelerated. Of course Thomasville, Georgia, was the most important town north of Madison. The first road authorized to be built was designated the Thomasville road and is known today by the older citizens as the "Old Thomasville Road." This road ran through the present settlement of Lovett, thence south through Bond or the well known Concord community, thence Hamburg, Carra-bell and Madison. It is now paved and known as the State road No. S-146. About this time Lucius **Church** and other citizens of the Cherry Lake community were successful in their efforts to have built the Cherry Lake road, which we know now as State road No. 53. Then came the Gum Swamp road which when

relocated many years later became most of State Road No. 150. There were others of course and when the connecting roads were added these gave the county a fair network before 1860.

No doubt the most important road to be constructed in the county was of another sort—the railroad!

In 1859, Captain Hardy H. **Griffin** was awarded a contract to clear the right of way and construct the roadbed for the Georgia and Pensacola Railroad from the Aucilla River to a point designated as Station No. 5—now the present town of Greenville. At the same time, Judge John C. **McGehee**, was given a similar contract to clear the right of way and construct the road from Station No. 5 to Madison, a distance of approximately 15 miles. The contract price paid Captain **Griffin** was \$800.00 while Judge **McGehee's** called for a payment of \$1,500.00.

In 1860 the first train entered the city of Madison. It is interesting to note an advance notice of this all-important event as it appeared in the Southern Messenger, under date of May 30, 1860:

"Railroad Coming!"

"The passenger trains on the Georgia and Pensacola Railroad now connect with the stages only four miles from this place. This new point of connection was made on yesterday.

"The depot building here is completed and we are now all ready for the arrival of the 'iron horse', which important event will doubtless take place in three or four weeks."

On June 30, the last spike necessary to connect the two lines was driven. (The Jacksonville, Pensacola and Mobile Railway had just recently entered Madison from the east.) July 4 was chosen as the day to celebrate this important event. It had been the custom of the people to celebrate July 4th in Madison. This was done by having a big barbeque, public

speaking and wound up with a good square dance. On this occasion would be an added attraction: Two "iron horses." One from the east bringing visitors and one from the west also bringing visitors to join those of the Madison country side in celebrating this occasion. A likewise celebration was held at Sandy Ford and every village of importance along the entire route of the railroad.

With the election of Abraham **Lincoln** in 1860, came the darkest cloud ever to cover the county. War was inevitable.

Concerning the causes that led to this great conflict which followed, the motives that inspired it, the sacrifices that sustained it, and the consequences which followed it, we leave to a later day.

However, may it eternally be said that no section of the state exemplified a greater chauvinism than Madison County.

Captain Richard **Bradford** of Madison was the first officer from Florida to sacrifice his life for the Confederacy. (This during the battle of Santa Rosa Island, October 9th, 1861).

Of such is our ante-bellum heritage. Our natural, civil, political, literary and ecclesiastical history possesses a variety and strange admixture of elements.

Yes, Madison County presents a long line of deeds which should inspire wholesome curiosity.

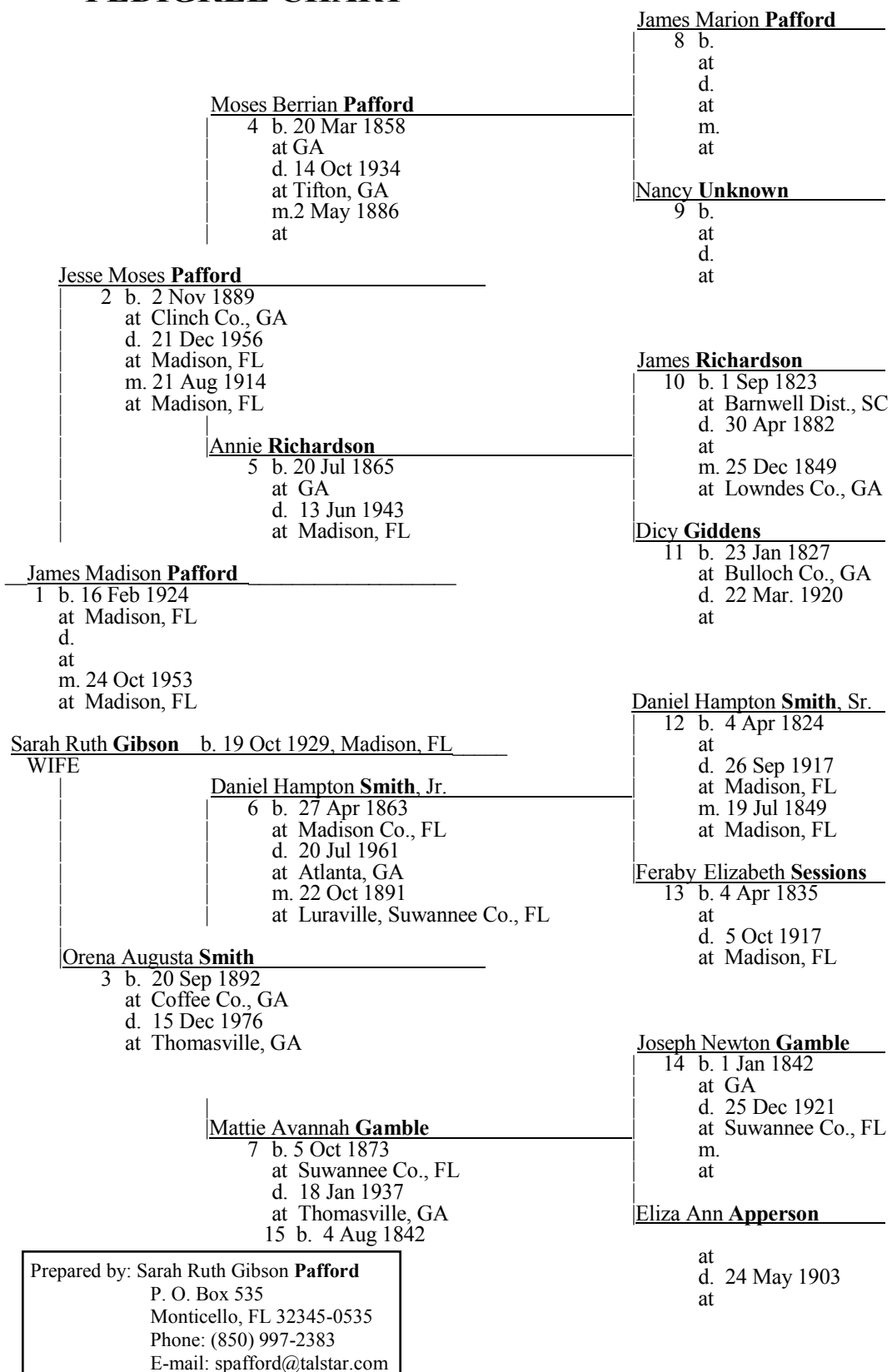

This notable case finally ended in victory for the defendant. It will be remembered that on the 11th of Nov. 1901, the defendant, Joel H. **Redding**, shot and killed Archie **Harby**, his brother-in-law, in a coach of a train on the South Georgia railroad while both were en route to Greenville.

There had been trouble between the two men for some time and this day brought the fatal culmination of the feud which resulted in the death of **Harby**. Within 48 hours of the commission of the act **Redding** had been apprehended, he having surrendered to the Sheriff, and was placed in the county jail where he has since been.

At 8:30 o'clock yesterday morning the jury reported to the court that they could not agree, but upon being sent back to their room for a further consideration returned at the time stated (9:40 o'clock) and rendered the verdict as above.

Those selected as jurors were: R. F. **Vann**, L. A. M. **Thomas**, H. R. **Fox**, H. T. **Caulk**, F. P. **Cox**, J. D. **Sirmans**, J. A. **Williams**, L. P. **Wilson**, J. D. **Beaty**, D. N. **Henderson**, C. F. **Dixon**, and G. W. **Ponder**.

The State's witnesses testified to the actual killing of **Harby** by **Redding** while both were in a car attached to a train of the South Georgia railway en route to Greenville.

The defense as developed by the testimony, was that **Harby** had threatened **Redding's** life again and again: that previous to the tragedy which culminated in the death of **Harby**, he (**Harby**) had waylaid at night and shot at **Reddings** wounding him severely in the arm. This is claimed to have occurred in the yard of the residence of Gen. C. S. **Harby**, father of the deceased, at whose house **Redding** was then living with his wife.
