3. Continue about 4 blocks 4. Turn left into parking lot behind building, or go to W. Rio Grande

AT FEATHER LAKE

Although Feather Lake was over 3 feet deep in late September, the water level dropped quickly and the lake went dry at the end of October. Still, our sanctuary is open for now. The fall colors are at their peak and are well worth seeing.

In spite of the 4-month dry period during late spring and early summer, and in spite of the current lack of water, the beaver that appeared last winter has not abandoned us. In fact, it has been quite industrious lately. If you visit, look for beaver sign as you walk around the lake, especially near the outlet on the back side of the basin.

In addition to fall colors and beaver sign, we also offer healthy exercise opportunities at Feather Lake. We have two workdays coming up, on **Sat., December 4** and **Sat., January 29**, both starting at **2 p.m.** Join us to help with sanctuary maintenance.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave. Hours are 8 a.m. to noon on Saturdays and 2 p.m. to dusk on Sundays. Admission is free.

Field Trips

Saturday, December 18, 2010 Reservoirs Down in the Valley.

McNary Reservoir has been called the best birding location in the valley east of El Paso, and is a notable haven for northern waterbirds,



such as resident Western and Clark's grebes, Eared Grebes, pelicans, gulls, egrets, cormorants, and many species of ducks. Fort Hancock often has more open mud flats than McNary, and these attract herons and White-faced Ibis. Tornillo is also known for its winter waterbird population. Raptors that have been sighted at one or more of these three reservoirs are Harris's Hawk, Northern Harrier, Ferruginous Hawk and Prairie Falcon.

We will stop for a lunch break near Tornillo Reservoir, where we may see Phainopeplas. Meet at 7:00 a.m. Feather Lake, 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave. Beginners and nonmembers always welcome. Contact Mark Perkins at 637-3521 or <u>mperkins4@elp.rr.com</u>.

Saturday and Sunday, January 8 and 9 2011, Bosque Del Apache NWR.

This is one of the more popular National Wildlife Refuges in the country. It's located about 180 miles north of El Paso off Interstate 25. Thousands of Snow Geese, Sandhill Cranes and ducks visit this area at this time of year. Bald Eagles have also been seen there.

On Saturday, January 8, we hope to arrange a bus tour of the Refuge, based on the number of people who sign up for the trip, so let us know as soon as possible if you would like to go. On Sunday, January 9, we'll go up to Sandia Peak in the Sandia Mountains (weather permitting) to see the rosy finch banding.

Grasshopper Sparrow and Baird's Sparrow.
