

An amazingly talented team of storytellers, musicians, and backstage magicians are about to unveil our interpretation of the powerful, touching, and important story known as La Cage aux Folles. I would like to recognize this team for finding this story worthwhile enough to dedicate countless hours these past three months to bring it to life for you today. Each has beautifully captured the essence of the colorful cavalcade of characters you are about to meet. Each has invested in the creation of setting via their attention to detail and skillful use of power tools and technology that forwards the story beautifully. Each has carefully considered the beautiful Jerry Herman music and how best to deliver each song to enhance the scenes you will watch. There are not words to adequately express my gratitude to these individuals but since our program is paperless, I must at least try...

Peter, Larch, Tim, Elyse, Shelly, Kate, Carly, and Renee thank you for keeping all of the wheels behind the scenes, beautifully lit, wonderfully audible, greased and running smoothly, for the problem-solving, for the research, for the communications, for the hearts, hands, and minds that you so freely gave to build a foundation, polish this gem, and prepare for our guests to arrive.

Thank you, Nick, for skillfully weaving together the voices and the music in spite of unprecedented conflicts and absences. You carefully selected such a wonderful team of musicians to do Jerry Herman's beautiful music justice. You are brilliant, efficient, and humble. Thank you for musical leadership and vision.

Kim and Lizzy, costuming any large musical in a fresh and original way is a massive undertaking. Costuming La Cage aux Folles is such a behemoth task that I nearly bagged the whole idea out of fear that it was just too big a budgetary undertaking for such a modest

organization as ours. You convinced me that we could do it and I am still in awe of the artistry and attention to color, movement, flow and balance you have achieved with your costuming. Each actor is a work of art and together when the stage is aglow with each character it is a masterpiece. A Note from the Co-Director...

Welcome to St. Tropez, the jewel of the Riviera!

Last summer when Lori Holm confided in me that *La Cage* Aux Folles would be the summer show for 2022, I blurted out, "Do you need a director". I did not think before speaking. I just knew I wanted to be involved in this show. I have been wanting to direct a musical after having directed *On Golden Pond* in 2020.

La Cage Aux Folles is notable for being the first Broadway musical to feature a loving male couple as the leads. It was also originally presented with large sets, big lavish production numbers, fabulous costumes, etc. It was one of the last big, flashy "old fashioned" musicals based on the ones Jerry Herman grew up with such as; Annie Get Your Gun, Call Me Mister, Brigadoon, etc. The book by Harvey Firestein, his first musical, is really a small simple love story with a farcical twist that does not need all the opulence of big sets and large casts. The 2nd Broadway revival of this show proved that intimate story telling best serves this material.

The intimacy of the Art Barn is one of the main reasons I wanted to direct this show. There are few venues as personable as this space. It allows us to bring you, the audience, into the story. Even if you have seen this show in other places, you have probably never seen this show as close up as you will tonight.

Another of my main goals for this story when Lori agreed that we would co-direct was to make sure the relationships presented were authentic. Keep it real was our mantra. George and Albin are two adults in an adult relationship with challenges most loving couples face; they may argue, they are seeing their only child become an adult and leave the nest to build his own, and they are wondering how to keep the initial spark that brought them together going after 20 years.

There are gives and takes in most relationships which is why I was excited to co-direct this show. Having worked with Lori on previous shows, I knew that this show would benefit from both of us providing our input. When we met to compare our initial blocking notes for the cast, we had the same vision for 95% of the show. The other 5% came from consensus on the parts we saw differently. I would not and could not co-direct this show or any other without Lori's input. I am forever grateful that she agreed to "marry" for the 8 or 9 weeks that we co-directed the show. If, we did our job right, you should not be able to tell whose direction was whose.

The cast has been a joy to work with in this production. The story could not have been told by a better group of people. I am blessed to have such a cast to tell this beautiful story of love and excitement. I know you will enjoy watching them perform as much as I have enjoyed helping them to bring this story to you.

This show also speaks to me because just like Georges and Albin, I have been with my partner for 20 years. We have also been involved in theater together for most of those

years. He is even doing tech for this show. I could not and would not want to do this show without him.

To you: As the years roll along and tide tumbles by there is one thing, I am certain of I am young and in love.

As I researched this show, I came across a story from Jerry Herman that I feel best sums up the true meaning of this story: In 1984, the show was in Boston for out-of-town tryouts. Boston was fairly conservative in the 80's. The production team of Arthur Laurents, Jerry Herman and Harvey Firestein, 3 gay men, were nervous of presenting this show with a same sex couple as the leads to this populace. At one of the early performances, an older couple, sat in front of them. They watched this couple's reaction as the show started. There was very little reaction. It was not until Georges started to sing Song in the Sand to Albin, that this older couple reacted to what they were seeing. He reached for his wife's' hand and they held hands through the rest of the song. It was at this moment through teary eyes that the 3 men of the production team realized they made something special.

You will be so dazzled by the costumes and wowed by the lights and sound. So come pour a drink and spend a few hours at La Cage Aux Folles

A Note from the Choreographer...

Welcome to La Cage!

My name is Liam Michael Dempsey, and I serve this company as both the Choreographer, and in the role of Hanna from Hamburg. I am so happy to have had a high heel in the forming of this production, and to have worked with such a kind and HILARIOUS ensemble.

Starting my work on this show, my first as Choreographer, I was truly challenged by the task of translating a traditionally large format show to an intimate (but awesome) space. A large portion of the visual appeal and a lot of the pop-cultural identity of this show relies upon the camp and absurdity of the Drag Queen ensemble the Cagelles, but also on their athleticism and chorus line dancing. When presented with the task of casting and creating this version of the Folles, my one and only priority other than creating a stellar final product was to honor and respect the art of Drag.

With this production going up at the start of LGBTQ+ Pride month, it was a requirement to me that the examples of character Drag we provide to the audience be as authentic as possible, and motivated by the understanding that while fun and entertaining to the masses, Drag is people's livelihoods, and it is, after all, the oldest protest art form.

Drag has found its own unique way to become part of the mainstream conversation thanks to pioneers of the Drag and Ballroom scene, and thanks to media like Rupaul's Drag Race, Dragula, We're Here etc. But what the mainstream conversation sadly often lacks is that Drag is not exclusive. Drag is not just Cisgendered Gay men in Femme Queen Drags. Drag is Drag Kings, Trans Women and Men, Queer, Non-Binary, Female and Male, all races and creeds, all bodies and abilities. It is not bound by something so archaic as the gender binary or societal norms. That being said, I am so proud of the A@A's Cagelles, all the things they are and represent, and to unveil them here for you tonight!

My sincerest thanks go to the role models, the Mothers and Teachers and Queens who continue to support me and guide me in this life. I love you.
