To continue to grow the sport and allow the next generation of rugby players and fans to have a home, we need to build permanent rugby fields in the area.

Rugby has an almost 50 year history in Northeast Wisconsin, starting with the Green Bay Celtics in 1972. Since that time all local clubs (Men's, High School, Youth) have been forced to be nomadic groups, moving from location to location. The youth program is now in its 7th year and has had to utilize 5 different fields. The Celtics have played at dozens of locations, and the HS boys have moved practice and match locations multiple times. Many of these fields have not been safe, much less regulation size.

Over the last six years additional clubs and seasons have been added. There are now Spring, Summer and Fall options for kids from grades K-12 and the Celtics play and practice almost year round. We foresee continued growth in all aspects of our programs. With that growth, the need for more dedicated rugby pitches has become critical.

WHY LAWRENCE?

There are a lot of reasons a location and partnership with the Town of Lawrence make sense. We began looking for communities to work with in 2017. Lawrence was growing and interested in working with rugby.

Lawrence is uniquely situated in the center of rugby in NE Wisconsin. During our conversations, it became clear that Lawrence was going to develop a destination location for youth sports. Our complex will bookend a larger development directly to the north. The town has offered us the chance to not only be part of the development, but to purchase the land and develop our permanent home.

The location right behind the Lawrence Town Hall is visible from I-41, only 1.5 miles off of either the Schuering Road or County S exit, and is located within 20 minutes of both the greater Green Bay and the Appleton Area. Lawrence is planning to install public parking, which will lower our costs and infrastructure significantly.

Once finished, our home will be able to host state and regional tournaments/championships that will benefit the local economy and boost rugby's visibility in the community. In addition, our youth program will gain a significant increase in the visibility in the area by being located next to a destination sports complex.







WHY Now?

Having permanent rugby fields has been talked about for decades, but there are a few items that have made this possible and needed now:

- We have a local community that is willing to partner with us, provide a location and is willing to put in some of the infrastructure (parking).
- We have developed a long-term plan to include the fields and facilities.
- Most importantly, the unprecedented growth in youth flag, middle school boys & girls, and high school boys & girls have created a need for additional fields in NE Wisconsin.





THE RUGBY COMPLEX

We have developed a multiphase, multi-year plan to develop the complex that will allow us to build as we go and still have a master plan to work from.

PHASE 1 - \$800,000

- Purchase 8.5 Acres from the Town and build first two fields \$450,000
- Develop Section 1 of the Building, which includes concession stand, bathrooms, storage and first set of seating for 250 people. - \$334,000

PHASE 2 - \$450,000

• Purchase and Develop land for fields 3 & 4.



PHASE 3 - \$1,130,000

• Build clubhouse, locker rooms and second set of seating with viewing deck.

FUNDRAISING CAMPAIGN

We have already received a commitment of \$100,000 over the next four years from MCL Industries and Bay Tek Entertainment.






GREEN BAY YOUTH RUGBY
