Aloha Kakou,

As I write, we are in the middle of Lent, the season of contemplative reflection upon the crucifixion of Jesus. Palm Sunday and Holy Week are soon upon us, where we observe Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem and his subsequent betrayal, arrest, torture and death on a cross by the religious and imperial powers that ruled in his day. Resurrection on Easter Sunday is God's vindication of Jesus' way of living and dying – for others, especially those who are depressed, defeated and downtrodden by this world's temporal powers, by the "games people play." That includes us.

We often say that Jesus' ministry, death and resurrection are his victory over the sin, the death, and the evil that so dominate and rule our lives, especially in ways that we hardly even notice. I am more convinced than ever — and I have never much been "unconvinced" — that sin, death and evil, often personified in the notion of an individual devil, are more patently obvious than ever before. Anyone who thinks that evil is just someone's ignorance that needs "educating" is naïve. Evil needs to be resisted.

And that's where it get complicated. Because I also think we too-often in this day and age like to point fingers at others, especially those different from us, not like us in skin color, race, ethnicity, orientation, gender, gender identity and especially faith, and call them "evil." Simply because they are in some way not like "us." They become "enemy" and "evil."

I worry more about our penchant for name-calling and stereotyping those not like us than I do what those others are doing – or trying to do – to us.

So, while I subscribe to the notion of sin, death, and evil's deep reality, I am reluctant to go running around pointing it out in any specific persons, ideologies or movements, religious, political or otherwise. We need a dose of humility even as we contemplate sin, death, and evil in our world and lives.

Jesus' Cross and the empty tomb come into play here – I resist and I persist, not because I have sin, death and evil all figured out, but because the promise of Cross and resurrection tells me that God in Christ is with me, with us, as we struggle in a bitterly divided, angry, hostile and violent world to come to grips with sin and forgiveness, death and resurrection, evil and redemption.

My prayers are for us together to continue to ponder these things in our hearts, to follow Jesus on the Way of the Cross, and to hope in his resurrection.
