I have a few openings on my two charter trips this summer. First trip is on the Pacific Dawn fishing July 11 and 12. We have the best of both worlds on this trip. First, we will be fishing out of Ventura and hitting all of the islands. At that time of the year we will have many opportunities for different species. If, by chance, the tuna arrive in good numbers, this trip will be moved to San Diego for tuna fishing. Obviously there will be an increase in price for the additional fuel. This trip, including food, costs \$405.

The second trip will be on the Pegasus out of San Diego on August 16 and 17. The cost of this trip is \$540 and that covers meals and Mexican permits. The new thing about Mexican visas is still an unknown at this time; that unknown cost is not included.

The White Sea bass were on the chew and that's what we wanted. Gary Gillingham found out Thursday morning that he had to work Friday so he sent the money he owed with Glenn Bummer. Now we had 10 anglers for tomorrow's trip. After work I drove up to Glenn's house and we rode up together. When we arrived Warren Harper was the only one there. Nice now we have choice of the good bunks. We loaded the ice chest onboard the boat and filled it with ice. Then it was off to get something for dinner and something for the next day's lunch.

A little while later Chuck showed up then Ernie. He informed

We left the dock somewhere between 9:00 and 10:00 Sunday night and headed for Eagles Nest at Santa Rosa Island in hopes of a White Sea Bass flurry. After arriving early Monday morning, we found the weather to be cold and windy, but by 6:00, the wind stopped blowing and the water got calm. We spent the next few hours waiting for croakers to hit. Ron Coleman was the first to get a bite and brought aboard a nice one, Paul Dawson soon pitched in his two cents and added two more Sea Bass to the catch. It was a special knot he was using to enable him the two fish that he is keeping secret. That was all for the morning bite, so Captain Pat took us out for an outstanding display of Rock Fish angling. Everyone loaded up with limits of Chucks,

Steve told us to set up with a dropper loop and a squid and drop it to the bottom. It did not take long and Don was hooked up to what turned out to be the Jack Pot other fish. Then Glenn landed a 20 lb YT and Warren landed a 21.9 lb White Sea bass. We hung around for a little while longer and caught a few Barracuda, Dennis 5.8lb and me 6.9lb. We also hooked a few Mud Marlin. So off we went to Santa Cruz and some Calico fishing.

We made a few stops and the currant wasn't right. We caught a few everywhere we went. But nothing near wide open. Finally on the last stop Warren landed a 3.3 lb Calico looked like Jack Pot but then I hooked up and landed a 3.7 lb for the Calico and Hat Jack pot.

All in all it was a nice day and the 9 anglers Ernie, Dennis, Glenn, Chuck, Warren, Mike, Laney, Don and the X Charter Master Rich Jenkins had an enjoyable day with friends. See you all on the water and may all your fishing trip be good.
