AP Corner

It has been a while since there has been news from the Achievement Program but one member has been busy working on a number of certificates. In addition to logging hours in various operating positions for his Chief Dispatcher certificate, Rusty Dramm has been building. I'll let Rusty tell us about it.



Herman Lohe's Meat Market in O Scale began as the 2020 SCWD modeling project. The challenge was to build a diorama using the DPM Birdie's Tavern in HO-, N- or O-scale of a maximum of 200 squares inches of area. Herman Lohe's meat market is representational of my family's style butcher shop in Manitowoc as I remember it as a small boy. I come from a long line of 'Schlachtermeisters' (that's German for 'Master Butcher') – two greatgreat grandfathers, great grand uncle and grand uncle Herman. As a little boy I used to explore the shop, play with the hand crank meat slicer and snoop around the slaughterhouse, smokehouse and stock barn on the property. Uncle Herman used to carve dried beef tongue with his big butcher's knife and give it to my brother Peter and me as a treat. We thought it very tasty while he laughed at us. The following describes how I constructed and detailed Uncle Herman's meat market.

Two Design Preservation O-scale building kits were used as the starting point for the meat market. The project includes a complete super detailed interior with butch shop store front retail room, meat prep room and complete upstairs living quarters. Detail items are mostly scratchbuilt from styrene, wood, paper and postcard stock, microscope slide glass, brass shapes and white metal castings. The marble countertop is a photo print of the actual marble countertop used in Uncle Herman's Meat Market. Meats, sausages and pig carcass were made from plastic pigs butchered with an X-Acto knife. Total build time – about 400 hours.

Modifications to DPM walls from the two kits were done a table saw with inserted tooth carpentry finishing blade, making smooth cuts. Doorway opening were done with a Dremel Tool and cutting disc. Modifications included making openings for the meat cooler and new doorways on the Birdie's tavern kit. From the Kristen's Corner Café, the rear and sidewall were sawn into wall parts for the cooler and residence side of the structure. Rear walls were sawn for accommodating gutter and downspouts.

The walls were assembled using Walther's Goo and clamped while curing. The sub-assemblies' walls/floors were first spray painted with black Krylon followed by white and camo/tan to prevent light leakage from the LED and incandescent lighting.

Window glazing is glass cut from microscope slides using a Micro-Mark Genuine Diamond Tip Scriber and affixed with Walther's Goo. Window shades are masking tape. Herman's meat market had ¾ inch thick plate glass windows. On at least one occasion, one of the plate glass store front windows was smashed by of all things a deer that had wandered into town and crashed through the plate glass window. So, I included a large crack in the right pane window so I could tell the story.

The three roofs were all tarpapered. This was simulated using blue painters masking tape painted with a warm gray paint and glossy black tar lines.



The sidewalk, street and gutter are styrene sheet and strip scribed and painted with Floquil concrete and weathered with Pan Pastels.



Scenery is Woodland Scenic ground foam with smokey tan grout for the dirt. The tree is a lead bendable Woodland Scenic hardwood tree kit with Silflor red maple foliage. The doghouse is a GC Laser kit with 600 grit emery cloth shingles. The German Sheppard dog's name is Chief.

In April, Rusty entered this model in the Structure contest at the Chicago O Scale Meet. By chance, Jim Landwehr, MidWest Region AP Chairman was one of the judges. Jim and his crew judged Rusty's Lohe's Meat Market under NMRA rules and awarded it 121 out of a possible 125 points---an amazing feat. This earned Rusty his first Merit Award toward his AP Structures certificate in addition to taking First Place in the Structures contest.

And the accolades didn't stop there. At the annual SCWD banquet, Rusty was honored with the Madison Mac Award for Modeling Achievement. Congratulations, Rusty.

The meat market is super detailed with complete room interiors using several scratchbuilt and commercial detail parts, figures and fixtures. Butcher's counter top is from a photo of Uncle Herman's actual counter.



The meat and sausage prep room. It includes a desk, chair, file cabinet, sausage making table with meat grinder and sausage extruder. The Fairbanks and Morris platform scale is the exact model that Uncle Herman had in the meat market. The meat rack has wieners made from lead solder, smoked hams and beef cuts created from plastic toy pigs fashioned (butchered) with an X-Acto knife.

A revision to the SCWD Electronic Red Book has begun! The first edition was sent to all members two years ago. I hope to have the second edition to the membership by September 2022.





River Railway Day". The SCWD Board has agreed to do so again this summer on Saturday, July 16th. Reservations have been made with the amusement park for use of their Blue Rose Pavilion and catering is being arranged. The park opens at noon and closes at 5 pm. A Puzzle for You

You like trains, or train watching, but have you ever wanted to go to an OPS (Operating Session) and run trains on someone else's



layout, but were afraid you wouldn't know what to do?

Model Railroad Operation is a fun and interesting role-playing game where the players (operators) use model trains to simulate the movements of the prototype railroad. Operators fill the roles of railroad employees like engineers, conductors, yardmasters, dispatchers, and more. Many of our SCWD members participate each month at multiple layouts to enjoy this fun and stimulating practice of critical thinking and problem solving in the context of railroad operations.

Now, there is a way for you to get your feet wet in this critical thinking and problem-solving railroad environment in the privacy of your own home through the use of railroad switching puzzles.

In July 2020, a group of SCWD members started a project to introduce more of our members to the enjoyment of railroad operations, or as our wives call it, playing trains. Some of us have been engaged in operating sessions for 20 years or more, and would like to get more of you involved.

The project involves getting one to solve a series of train switching puzzles (on paper, or your computer) in the least number of moves possible. You can then submit your solution to see if yours was done in the least number of moves.

Beginners can start with 3 introductory puzzles to show the kinds of skills used in railroad switching operations. Then, you can advance to a series of more advanced puzzles written and based on actual SCWD member area layouts. Or, if you have already been to an OPS session, you could do an introductory puzzle, and jump right into the more challenging ones.



MADISON HOBBY STOP




