The training has been designed to educate professionals who assist in the treatment and educational process of those diagnosed with Autistic Spectrum Disorders.



Congratulations to both Haley and Kyle for their amazing accomplishments. We could not be more proud!






Tyler Smith














Student Spotlight — Christopher Serrano



"Christopher? He is so cute! I love him". This is the common reaction from the therapists and


