
I received the following from Jim Cook:


Freedom Cycles of Grandview, Missouri announces the expansion of their rider support program. The new program includes the

How about this, an ATV class! This would be a first. They would be assigned rows five minutes after the last bike and since it would be a qualifier style enduro, time keeping wouldn't be necessary. If you are asking yourself, why ATVs in an enduro? It would give ATV riders the opportunity to ride an enduro and they would riding with the arrows.

On the subject of safety: There have been several bad accidents lately at Chadwick, from what I understand two riders have been killed recently. Both of these accidents and one fatal accident a couple of years ago happened on either 171 or 110. These are the main roads that go past the campgrounds.

When I started riding with Terry Brumley, he would go like stink in the tight stuff, but when we got out on the two track, not even the gravel roads, but anything passable by a truck, Terry would slow and cruise. So, if you kids (of all ages) have the urge to crank it up, do it where it takes some skill. If you're going as fast as you can on some tight rough trail, pull over and let Terry by.

be moved out if you simply sit out for two years.

The Missouri Hare Scramble Championship meeting was held on January 20, 2001, in Lake Ozark, Missouri. Frank Leivan opened the meeting with a discussion of problems that have been encountered at some events in the past couple of years. After much discussion, it was decided to allow all events to remain in the series. It is clear that the series wants events that conform to the MHSC rulebook.

The next order of business was the election of three officers. Rick Stroup will remain as ATV scorekeeper, but will now have assistance. Steve *The guy from Chat Rats* will be the Motorcycle scorekeeper and Tom Eidam will be the new Vice Chairman/Treasurer.

Tom Eidam reported on the RFID scoring system. This system is similar to the bar code system currently in use, but would use a small disk attached to the rider. Tom is still working out the bugs. An additional \$1500 was allocated for further research and development.

Many rule changes were discussed. Many of the suggested changes failed to pass on the vote of the members. The rules that did pass the vote are as follows:

- 1. If an ambulance is not present it is required that the promoter inform the riders prior to the event and allow them a full refund of their entry fee.
- 2. The computer scoring will be used at **all** events.
- 3. New Double arrow rule. If the promoter puts two arrows side by side on the trail, the riders are required to go between them. The 20 foot rule will not be in effect.
- Course cutting now comes with a standard 1 lap penalty for each time a rider is convicted of cutting the course.
- 5. New classes The 125 B class was eliminated. A 0-200 C class was added in its place. The advancement out of all of the C Classes happens when a rider places in the top three in the year end standings.
- 6. The two year portion of the advancement rule was eliminated. This means that if you advance to a class, you must ride to prove out of the class. You will not

Congratulations go out to June for winning first over all in the women's class in the Arkansas Hare Scramble Series! Good job!


