
I'm enjoying attending your clubs meetings. At each one I bring



Pat Lutes, AzFRW Scholarship Committee Those who found time to see Dinesh d' Souza's "America the Movie," have insight into a key mission of AzFRW Scholarship Standing Committee. We calculated aim at tomorrow's young women leaders whom Dinesh tells are the real hope of spreading our

Republican values in today's America. We do this as an organization by fundraising and then budgeting for this commitment each year, a commitment that would not be possible without the generosity of our member clubs and outstanding 2012-15 Executive Committees, who made a renewed pledge to support AzFRW's only proprietary and perpetual Scholarship, The Laura Bush Scholarship, with suggested donations, budget, and state achievement award points. We do this as a Committee by state wide promotion and establishing a trust relationship with Arizona's colleges and universities who support our continuing effort on their websites, sending us outstanding applicants each year. We wish to arm young women with the tools to explain how traditional American virtues sustain prosperity and freedom, and Progressive arguments about "liberation" and "justice" undercut them. Finally, the 2200 member strong Arizona's **Federation of Republican Women** is the backbone true of this **AzFRW** Scholarship mission.

At press time, Scholarship prepares to choose the 2014 AzFRW Laura Bush Scholarship winner from a wide field of applicants. In 1988 The **AzFRW** established a perpetual scholarship. It's now named after First Lady Laura Bush due to her extensive work in the field of Education. We have made great progress, for example, in placing young women with conservative ideals in the field of Education who are teaching now in Arizona schools.

Our Committee also evaluates and chooses candidates for the National Federation of Republican Women Scholarships. This year we were fortunate to offer the application of Amanda Oien to compete nationally for the 2014 NFRW Pathfinder Scholarship.

In early spring we awarded the 2014 AzFRWs Dodie Londen Memorial TARS Award to Mackenzie Shane at the AZ TARS Annual Awards Banquet, and we also recognized the past three recipients of this AzFRW Scholarship, an award which helps our TARS with travel to the National TARS Conference in Washington DC each summer. Arizona TARS won four top honors:

Mary Williams postmarked no later than <u>June 1, 2015</u> for review and her signature. She then submits the forms to NFRW.

<u>CARING FOR AMERICA</u>: Individual clubs wishing to submit their Caring for America projects should fill out the club form and send it on to the AzFRW Caring for America Chairman Anita Romero postmarked by <u>June 1, 2015</u>.

She will then submit a Caring for America project from one club from Arizona for recognition at the NFRW levels. Clubs will compete against clubs within the following divisions: Small -10-25 members; Medium: - 26-75 members; Large: 66-150; Mega: 151+

<u>CAMPAIGN VOLUNTEER AWARD</u>: Campaign volunteer hours from <u>July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2015</u> may be submitted based on criteria on the NFRW web site to the campaign chairman of each club who will then turn in the total volunteer hours for the club and the name and total hours of the member with the most hours to the AzFRW Chairman Zanetta Broughan and to President Mary Williams who will then submit the total number of hours from all club members and the member with the highest total to the NFRW Campaign Committee by <u>June 30, 2015</u>.

MEMBERSHIP INCENTIVES FOR CLUBS AND MEMBERS: Membership Award: Club with the greatest membership percentage increase in 2014 (nomination may be made by either the club president or the AzFRW Membership Chairman Joan Lang). Forms are then submitted to the AzFRW President for signature and submission to the NFRW.

- Best use of technology to increase club membership;
- Outstanding club member for membership recruitment.

However, a local club may submit its public relations program to the AzFRW Publicity/Public Relations Chairman ViciLee Jacobs for consideration by the state to represent the state, keeping in mind that judging criteria will be based on how effective the program is in representing the State federation and in the working together of local clubs for the promoting of the State Federation. The deadline for submission is July 15, 2015. Reports may be in scrapbook or electronic form.


