

Hopping Hill Curriculum



History

At Hopping Hill, within the History curriculum, the clearly defined skills of Historical Enquiry, Chronology and Knowledge, and Understanding are taught. We aim to foster an enthusiasm for historical learning and an ability to talk confidently about the history of Britain and the wider world, including knowledge of key dates and significant historical figures.

History is taught from Years 1 to 6. Each year group studies three units, each taught for half a term. History is a discrete subject but links are made with other subjects when relevant, particularly English and Art. Each unit of study, which is based on the Focus Learning Challenge Curriculum, aims to teach children key historical skills, using a range of artefacts and sources. At the end of each unit, children take part in an investigation related to the learning, which allows them to share the skills, dates and facts they have been taught. During the year children will also have the opportunity to take part in a History quiz where they can apply the knowledge they have learnt. In Early Years, History is covered through 'The Understanding of the World' strand of the EYFS statutory framework and forms part of the continuous provision.
