



## Mr. Currier Presented at the ASEE Conference in Baltimore



This summer, Mr. Scott Currier, 4th Grade Science & Social Studies Teacher, presented at the American Society of Engineering Education (ASEE) conference in Baltimore, MD. His presentation was a summary of work that had been done in collaboration with 3-6th grade teachers from Highland Lakes.

Mr. Currier was the elementary representative on the TaLENt presentation team. TaLENt is the Teacher Leader Engineer Network. The TaLENt Project was a collaborative group of 15 teacher leaders that collectively created an engineering guidebook for teachers. TaLENt centers on improving engineering instruction in K-12 schools. His presentation was a summary of the book study he facilitated at Highland Lakes.

Mr. Currier plans to implement engineering challenges into his daily science lessons. He hopes to continue to collaborate with curriculum design here at the district level, school level, and along with his peers at Rice University and Arizona State University. Next summer the Talent group may have the opportunity to travel internationally.


















Mrs. Slavick Welcome to 7th Grade Math







## **HLS POLICIES**

ATTENDANCE CUTS Program (Court Unified Truancy Suppression): To encourage and improve school attendance, Deer Valley Unified School District has implemented a truancy program in partnership with Maricopa County Juvenile Court. Highland Lakes will be tracking attendance very closely. Your child is expected to be at school every day, unless there is an excused reason not to be. A student that is absent more than ten percent (18 days) of the required number of school days per year is considered to have "excessive absences" whether the absence is excused or unexcused. If a student should start a pattern of excessive absences, you will be contacted by letter or phone. The education of your child is extremely important to us. This program is another way of working with the community to ensure a quality education for all students. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact the front office at 623-376-4300. Please report all absences to the attendance line at 623.376-4390.

#### **SIGNING OUT**

To ensure that our academic time is respected, we are asking that parents do not sign out their children between 3:15 and 3:30. Fifteen minutes a day, added up over a month represents almost a full day of classes missed. PHOTO ID REQUIRED.

#### **PARKING**

- There is no parking or waiting on 63rd Avenue from Union Hills to Utopia. If you park or wait on 63rd Avenue, tickets have been issued.
- Please remember that our parking lots get very hectic in the morning and afternoon. Please do not leave you vehicle unattended along the curb at any time. Remember, our main focus is to keep all of our students safe.
- The car pool parking spots are reserved for those registered with the TRP program. The other reserved spots were won at school events. Please use courtesy and <u>do not park</u> in those spots.
- It's against the law to park in the handicap spots (<u>even for a second</u>) without a handicap parking permit. Please keep these spots open for families that need them.
- Parents please be considerate of our families that live close to school and respect our neighbors when picking up and dropping off students.
