#### Pastor's Corner

So. guess what came to mind for me today? I realized that it has been (almost) exactly 5 years since I started at Puckety as the pastor here. The PNC extended the call in the early months of 2020 (pending congregational vote – which was accompanied by delays because COVID hit at the start of March that year). So, my first "official" Sunday wasn't until the middle of June. But as a point of reference, I've used *June Ist* as the starting point, so it will be 5 years by the time most of you are reading this. How grateful I am. What a blessing this time has been to Wiebke and me. As each year passes, we feel more at home, and I continue to see God's goodness all around me, including through the work and actions of so many of you. We, as a nation, just observed *Memorial Day* a week ago. It's a kind of "turning point," isn't it? It has a distinctive combination of "looking back" (remembering those who have gone before and sacrificed for us to be where we are) along with a "looking forward" (because Memorial Day is considered the "unofficial" start of summer). I find myself resonating with that tension, in a good and positive way. I look back and remember the things God has done, the people he's worked through,

the sacrifices made, the distance we've covered, and the struggle involved. At the same time, taking that all in, it gives hope and anticipation for the "light" and "warmth" and "growth" that is ahead. I pray that you are also ready to welcome it – just like the garden work of the summer – even if it means "sharpening our tools," "bending down" (to serve), and "getting our hands dirty" (in the good way) with ministry, both within and beyond the walls of our congregation. I know that summer is often a time when we slow down – there's definitely a place for that – I often long for some of the popular activities to "take a break." That's good. But I certainly hope, as the author of Hebrews says near the end of his letter, that we don't neglect our community faith life: "Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encourage one another on as we see the day (of the Lord's return) approaching" – instead, "let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds" (Hebrews 10:24-25)



#### <u>A Devotional for You</u> - Read **Hebrews 8:7-10** + **Hebrews 9:21-24**

This devotional serves as a tie-in to the sermon series (between the June 1st & June 8th messages)

To understand the difference between an original and a copy, consider trying to photograph the largest animal – a whale. Roy Chapman Andrews describes it (this is from the *NIV Student Bible* my mother gave me as a graduation present – which served me well in college): "Once in Alaska, we raised a humpback's spout and ran up close before the animal submerged. Ten minutes later, without warning, the floor of the ocean seemed to rise and a mountainous black body, dripping with foam, heaved upward, almost over our heads. It paused an instant, then fell sidewise to be swallowed up by a vortex of green water. With the camera ready in my hands I stared at the thing. If it had fallen the other way, the vessel would have been crushed beneath its 40 tons."

How can you adequately communicate the impact of something that immense? Photographers have recorded humpback whales bursting from the water (I was fortunate enough to see some breach in *Kenai Fjords National Park*). I took about 50 photos with my special lens, but no photograph can capture the sheer bigness of such an animal. A baby blue whale gains a ton of weight a month. An adult blue whale's heart weigh's 1,000 pounds. How can any 2-dimensional phot convey such "bigness"?

Even the best photograph is just a copy, a representation of the subject's reality. No 8x10 rectangle can contain a whale. Not photo sequence of the Grand Canyon is as grand as the canyon itself. The photo simply preserves a two-dimensional copy of reality. Hebrews uses that word "copy" to describe the devices and rituals of the Old Testament: Passover feasts, Tabernacle vessels, sacrifices and priestly duties. They were *shadows*, expressing the reality to come in Jesus Christ. No ceremony alone, however elaborate, can adequately express the experience of God himself, any more than a photo of a whale or a mountain can adequately represent a whale or a mountain. The OT rituals were a copy ... Christ is the original.

It may seem foreign to our experience, but take the time to appreciate what the author is doing by pulling up hallowed images of the faith heritage to explain how Christ revealed once and for all the meaning of these images only hinted at. As always, Hebrews stresses the advantages of living now – in other words, of genuinely living under the New Covenant instead of trying to return to the Old Covenant. [Did you know that the divisions of the Bible called "Testaments" literally mean "Covenants"? OT = old covenant and NT = new covenant. Think on that.]

Because of Christ, sacrifices (along with human attempts at self-justification) are no longer necessary, and God's laws are now written in our minds and on our hearts, not in a formal code (8:10). "It is finished," the High Priest cried out from his Altar on the cross. Hebrews 10:12 makes special mention that Christ "sat down" after finishing his priestly duties. That imagery is lost on us because we don't realize that Jewish priests never sat down; the tabernacle and the temple (intentionally) did *not have seats*! It symbolized their work was never done, never finished. But Christ finished it. Copies have some value — my photo albums are priceless to me because of my poor memory. And a photograph of a humpback conveys much to those who will never encounter one. But as the author of Hebrews asks, who would prefer a copy to the real thing?

# As Puckety Church, we collectively improve our community and world

MUST Partnership (Myanmar)

Here is a recent report from the MUST Earthquake Relief Team. David Lian's school shows how they are sharing God's love with many who are so desperately in need due to the recent earthquake. It should remind us how blessed we were to be able to send over \$3,000 to MUST to help them resolve other internal needs, so that they can focus on God's plan to use them to spread the gospel!

On April 19, 2025, the **MUST Relief Team** embarked to provide aid to earthquake victims. They carried with them \$12,000 (50,000,000 Kyats) to support their efforts. The team arrived in Naypyidaw, where they visited the Shwe Kyarpyin

Temporary Hospital. They provided financial assistance to 62 hospitalized victims who were in dire need due to their severe injuries and loss. The following day, on April 20, the team departed for Mandalay. The local pastor there provided training and guidance on how to initiate relief efforts for the victims in Mandalay. They distributed essential items, including toiletries, food, drinking water, and cash to 70 households. The team also visited two temporary camps for victims who had lost their homes and family members.





They provided assistance to those in need. It was disheartening to observe that some affluent individuals were reluctant to engage with the impoverished residents, many living on the streets. One camp housed approximately 3,000 victims. Among the displaced were refugees from war zones. The team provided some of them with cash assistance as well. Some camps posed significant risks, as desperate individuals rushed to the relief team, creating chaotic situations. On April 22, the team set off for Sagaing City, one of the most vulnerable areas affected by the earthquake. Many residents were homeless and injured.



Due to the political situation, the team could only reach those living on the outskirts of the city. At the Kuatkayee Camp the team provided mattresses, blankets, food, various beverages, and drinking water. They also assisted another



camp near a monastery that had suffered severe damage by providing cash support.

The team then traveled to Yaykhaein Village, the *epicenter of the earthquake*, to assist the victims. They focused their efforts on those whose homes had been completely destroyed. After a long day, the team departed for Pyinoolwin. The next morning, on April 23, they left for Tataoo City, where they continued their relief efforts. They purchased additional supplies and aided in Einwa City. The situation was dire, with corpses still present due to the lack of rescue efforts in smaller towns.

Most rescuers were concentrated in larger cities like Mandalay, Sagaing, and Naypyidaw, leaving smaller communities in desperate need of help. Visiting these areas was a harrowing experience, filled with discomfort and the weight of the tragedy that had unfolded. The MUST



Relief Team remains committed to providing support and assistance to those affected by this disaster, recognizing the urgent need for continued efforts in the face of overwhelming challenges. Thank you for your ongoing prayers.

#### **Myanmar Mission Report**

Despite the ongoing challenges in Myanmar, we are doing well in our ministries, and I thank you for your prayers and support. The political situation is marked by civil war and military repression. The junta has intensified its violent tactics ... leading to a humanitarian crisis. Even though the military's grip on power is weakening, they have enacted a new conscription law, requiring all able-bodied individuals to join the military, even children.

- 1. The <u>Myanmar Undergraduate School of Theology</u> (MUST) is thriving. Students are preparing for final exams. MUST is providing the best theological education for ministries in Myanmar. We are also supporting students financially, allowing them to continue their studies safely. It is expected that three students will graduate in July, ten in January, and ten more next July. Many upcoming graduates have committed to serving the Lord in their respective communities.
- 2. The children at <u>Agape House</u> are also doing well but anxious; their main prayer request is for peace in Myanmar. Some will learn computer skills, guitar, piano, English, mathematics, and sewing during March to May.
- 3. In 2024, we held intensive Bible training sessions at the Bible Center, reaching many non-believers.

Three high school students have accepted Christ and been baptized, and we are nurturing their faith.

4. Our daughter churches are growing in the hands of the Lord, multiplying members year by year and becoming more spiritually mature.

#### 5. Prayer Topics:

- Peace for Myanmar
- Our campus is currently home to over 40 students and 45 orphans, along with staff family members. Unfortunately, our facilities are severely overcrowded, making it increasingly difficult to provide the environment these children deserve. Many of our children are living in cramped conditions, lacking the necessary room to study and live.

As we reflect on our mission to serve God's children, we are reminded of the biblical call to care for the least among us. The need for expansion is urgent; without it, we risk compromising the quality of care and support we provide.

By expanding our campus, we can create a more conducive environment for learning and personal development.

Your fervent prayers and generous support are crucial in making this vision a reality. This is an investment in the lives of children eager to learn and grow in the love of Christ. We pray that through this initiative, we can share the love of Christ and invite many to become members of our church.
