# → From the Pastor →

Then Jesus cried again with a loud voice and breathed his last. At that moment, the curtain of the Temple was torn in two, from top to bottom."

Matthew 27:50-51

Have you ever wondered what the tearing of the Temple curtain meant? To understand, we must look at the layout of the Temple. Behind the curtain was the Holy of Holies. 


