SEPTEMBER MEETING

The meeting was held at John & Sandy Pyrros home on Sept 21st.

Highlights of the business meeting:

The secretary and treasurer reports were read and approved.

A sample of the work done by a plaque vendor was shown – no action taken on new plaques

Membership – we received a check from a prospective new member. Since he has not attended a meeting, no action was taken until he attends.

The Fall Cruise was set for October 19th (Date change)

Lois Martin reminded us of the election for CTCI Director at Large. She also mentioned the two regionals set for 2009 – Tulsa, OK (July 3-6) and Vancouver, BC (Aug 8-20) Rooms for Vancouver must be booked by Mar 1st for preferential rate. Additionally there is word of a not yet sanctioned CTCI International convention for 2010 in Dayton, OH. Tentative date June 15-20.

Nominations were made for the two positions up for election for 2009/10 – Vice President and Treasurer.

The Holiday party has been scheduled for Dec 7th at Dolce Vita. Price to be determined.

Dash Removal (continued)

- 12. Disconnect the heater controls from the plenum and the windshield wiper control from the wiper motor.
- 13. Unbolt the two brackets on the bottom of the dash on either side. Leave the brackets in place to hold the dash up when loose.
- 14. Unscrew the screws from around the top of the dash.

You now should be able to wiggle it out.

TECH TIPE

Dash Removal

Taking out your dash? Here is a comprehensive list of steps to take. You can leave all the wire and gauges in the dash. Take out the radio as it is heavy, but this is not required

- 1. Remove the steering column 4 screws beyond the adjusting nut, two under the dash, the bolt at the steering box, the horn wire and the turn signal wires
- 2. Remove the inside trim around the windshield
- 3. Disconnect the vent controls on each side of the engine compartment so the cables are free.
- 4. Disconnect or remove the battery
- 5. Disconnect all the wiring in the engine compartment the leads to the generator, od solenoid (if applicable) distributor, regulator, water temp and oil pressure sending units, lights and the horns at the wiring blocks on each side of the car.
- 6. Take off the cover and grommet off at the firewall where the main harness passes through.
- 7. Take the harness out of the clips along the engine compartment. If you are rewiring, you can cut the wires where they pass through the firewall to make things easier.
- 8. Disconnect the power seat and window harnesses from the main harness at each side of the dash-you will have to remove the kick panels to get access.
- Disconnect the door light switches at each door and pull the wires back inside the car. You do this by pulling out the door switches and pulling out the wires at the back.
- 10. Pull back the carpet and disconnect the rear harness and shifter. These connections are made before the seat although if not you will have to pull the seat and carpet out.
- 11. Disconnect the tach and speedo controls from the back of each. These are threaded on.
