


Tech Tip Automatic Shifter Repair

Does your shifter have a lot of play and you have to wriggle it around or pull up on the shifter in order to get the car to start? The problem may not be the neutral start switch but parts within the shifter. There are two pieces that can help this situation. Replacing part # 7A133, a bushing and part # 7241, a pin, will tighten up the assembly. Both parts are available. So if you have any play in your shifter this is a good place to start and is not an expensive repair. And it can be done without getting under the car. Re-enactment's

The historic village was known as the Howell Works in the early 19th-century. At that time, it was a thriving industrial community which produced pig and cast iron. The buildings, which remain today, include a general store, blacksmith shop, carpenter's shop, manager's house, foreman's house and a church. One of the workers' row house buildings is now the Allaire Visitor Center and Museum.

Train Museum & Train Ride (\$6.00)

Established in 1953, the Pine Creek Railroad is an example of rail travel at the height of the steam era in the United States. The diesel, narrow-gauge trains are operated by the NJ Museum of Transportqation.
