- Must hold a valid Class-A CDL.

- Must have a positive attitude, attention to detail and safety orientated.
- Must be able to lift 50-75 lbs.
- Must be able to sit for long periods of time, bend, squat, push and pull, crawl, climb, and reach above shoulder level and in all directions.

Primary Responsibilities:

- After dispatch, drivers may utilize a sleeper cab while pulling bulk or pneumatic trailers long distances.
- Drive both long and short distances always be on time.
- Keep the truck and associated equipment clean and in good working order.
- Inspect truck and trailer at the start and finish of the workday, recording and reporting any defects found.
- Able to read maps or use GPS to plan the most efficient route.
- Report to dispatch any incidents encountered on the road, monitor road conditions, watch for traffic congestion, and follow accident procedures when needed.
- Follow all applicable federal, state, and local traffic laws.
- Keep accurate paperwork, including BOLs for each load and properly turn it all into dispatch.
