FANNIE MAE JOHNSON ELECTED AS CITY COUNCILWOMAN FOR THE CITY OF MERIDIAN, MS

In our last issue we brought you a story in our Spotlight section of a food shelter with a unique name and spirit that has been permeating the Meridian, MS area for decades. The placed is named L.O.V.E.S Kitchen, which stands for Lauderdale Outreach and Volunteer Effort and it dynamic and charismatic director is Ms. Fannie Mae Johnson. Ms. Johnson shows that it is not just a job for her but a commitment to help those who need help. Ms. Johnson announced her intentions to run for City Council in the city of Meridian. She was described as a Politian that will look out for the interest of the homeless, stranded and down & out. Ms. Johnson and L.O.V.E.s Kitchen was recently featured with Chef Rushion McDonald on

the

Steve Harvey Show. On June 5, 2017, Ward 3 overwhelmingly responded to Ms. Johnson campaign by casting 82% of the vote towards her.

Johnson said that many of her plans may be unrealistic but narrows her focus on preventing these problems at the beginning, especially issues that affect the homeless population.

"Things that would prevent the homeless population from growing," Johnson said. "I would love for L.O.V.E.'s Kitchen to not be needed."

Johnson said she drew not only on her experience with L.O.V.E.'s Kitchen but also her experience as a civil service senior administrator with the military.

WHAT IS DOMESTIC VIOLENCE?

What is Domestic Violence?

It is the violent or aggressive behavior within the home, typically involving the violent abuse of a spouse or partner. Every 9 seconds a woman is beaten in the United States. Domestic violence is the leading cause of injury to women—more than car accidents, muggings, and rapes combined. Everyday in the US, more than three women are murdered by their husbands or boyfriends. Based on reports from 10 countries, between 55 percent and 95 percent of women who had been physically abused by their partners had never contacted

non-governmental organizations, shelters, or the police for help.




SPOT LIGHT—ASLANe'S MISSION

WHO AND WHAT IS HHS? US DEPT. OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

HHS is the United States government's principal agency for protecting the health of all Americans and supporting the delivery of essential human services, especially for those who are least able to help themselves. As such, the delivery of treatment and services to persons experiencing homeless is included in the activities of

the Department. The coordination of these services, both within the Department, as well as with our Federal partners who provide housing and complementary service programs, is a critical component of achieving the goal of preventing and ending homelessness.

The U. S. Interagency Council on Homelessness (USICH) coordinates the Federal response to homelessness by

partnering with 19 Federal agencies, state and local governments, advocates, service providers, and people experiencing homelessness to achieve the goals outlined in the first Federal strategic plan to prevent and end homelessness,



NEW BOOK RELEASE: THE MILLIPEDE EFFECT




