### President's Message

Summer went fast, and it was a hot one this year! We had another successful yard sale in June while our devoted volunteers braved some nasty weather. It once again provided the opportunity for us to do some housecleaning and it generated almost \$3,000 in revenue.

There has been a flurry of maintenance activity in the village this summer! The Olds General Store porch has been rebuilt to fix structural issues and the new floor looks beautiful. The barn loft door had significant wood rot and has been rebuilt. The Lathrop house basement foundation was repaired. The exterior of the Baldwin house, Chapman house, Lathrop house, and the cupola are all undergoing carpentry repairs and a full exterior repainting. The Cabin exterior has been pressure washed and resealed. We're down to the last room in the Chapman house that needs restoration, the final upstairs bedroom. The floor was recently refinished and we are turning our attention to the walls and ceiling.

Work is almost finished on remodeling the **Lathrop rental space** entryway, meeting room, bathroom, and kitchen. We are excited to more aggressively promote this refreshed space and expect our rental volume to climb in the coming months.

As we head into cooler weather, it marks the **start of our annual event season** for the latter half of each year with **Harvest Festival** coming up on **Saturday, September 27**<sup>th</sup>! Please help spread the word so we have great attendance. # Speaker Series October Presentation-Dennis Dimengo

October 28th, 7:00 PM at the Strongsville Old Town Hall (18825 Royalton Rd, Strongsville, Oh 44136)

Herbert Addison Burns will be presenting "Ohio's History of the Underground Railroad: A Theological Tug of War". This lecture presents certain underground railroad operatives' methods of helping fugitive slaves escape to freedom in Ohio. The central theme is the biblical view supporting the establishment of the underground railroad in opposition to gross misinterpretations of biblical scripture supporting chattel slavery.

This presentation will add considerable context and background to the role Strongsville residents played in the organization of the Underground Railroad and the movement of escaped slaves through Northeast Ohio to freedom.

## A Twist In our City's History—David Maloney

Just over sixty years ago on April 12, 1965 an unforgettable calamity swept through the town of Strongsville, Ohio in the form of an F4 intensity tornado that left a permanent mark on our history. Due to a series of unfortunate and unordinary meteorological events over the midwestern United States, the world's

4th largest tornado outbreak in history took place which became known as the 1965 Palm Sunday Tornado Outbreak. This outbreak resulted in as many as 55 confirmed tornadoes and approximately 270 dead across the Midwest.

The tornado which made Strongsville its target most notably sat directly on top of the Westwood Estates neighborhood adjacent to the Muraski Elementary School resulting in widespread destruction and soon after cut directly through the grounds of the St. Joseph Church and Parish School which destroyed the original Quonset hut church and caused significant damage to the school among other buildings in the surrounding area.

The deepest loss to our small community that fateful night was the loss of six-week-old Lisa Ann Sposet who was unfortunately taken by the tornado in the Westwood



Estates neighborhood leaving her family and community heartbroken. Although the decades may continue to pass since this disaster, the legacy of this unforgettable event and its impacts on our once small town continue to live on within the halls of the Strongsville Historical Society and the memories of our fellow community members, many of whom still live here today.
