DUES NOTICE...The National portion of the dues will be going up next year 2023-2024. The National per capita dues shall be eighteen dollars (\$18.00) per annum for Senior members beginning in Fiscal Year (FY) 2024, with a one dollar (\$1.00) increase in FY 2026 (\$19.00), FY 2028 (\$20.00) and FY2030 (\$21.00) National Junior member dues remain at two dollars and fifty cents (\$2.50) per annum with a \$.50 (fifty cent) increase in FY2026 to three dollars (\$3.00) per annum, FY2028 (\$3.50), and FY2030 (\$4.00) That means starting dues for 2023-2024 will be \$18 for National and \$7 for Department...\$25 to Department for Seniors no increase for Juniors at this time.

In the Spirit of Service Not Self For Our Hometown Heroes, God and Country

Legislative

October 2022

Greetings Members,

Not a whole lot has been going on, as stated in my last bulletin on August 10th, President Biden signed the PACT Act, which will deliver critical health care and other benefits for veterans. The PACT Act was named in honor of Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson, a decorated combat medic who died from a rare form of lung cancer. The PACT Act will provide high-quality health screenings and services related to potential toxic exposures, codifies VA's new process for evaluating and determining presumption of exposure and service connection for various chronic conditions, the legislation removes the need for certain veterans and their survivors to prove service connection if they are diagnosed with one of 23 specific conditions. The PACT Act also requires the VA to conduct new studies of veterans who served in Southwest Asia during the Gulf War and analyses of post-9/11 veterans' health trends. The bill also delivers critical resources to the VA to ensure it can deliver timely access to services and benefits for all eligible veterans. In short, this is historic legislation for our veterans and legislation that was on the top of the list for the American Legion.

In late August into early September, members of the Legion Family convened in Milwaukee, WI for National Convention. Our new leadership team for the year was duly elected. The new National Commander for the American Legion is Vincent J. "Jim" Troiola, the new National Commander for the Sons of the American Legion is Chris Carlton, and our new National President is Vickie Koutz from the Department of Indiana. Her focus this year is to honor our veterans every day, and her project will be on National Veterans Creative Arts Festival companions. Her project on companions is triple tiered – money for a meal plan, travel, and/or separate hotel room if needed for non-family member companions. Koutz is also working to raise awareness on our country's Prisoners of War and Missing in Action.

Also in Mid-August members of the American Legion and other VSO's went to Capitol Hill in Washington D.C. to urge members of Congress to pass legislation on the Afghan Adjustment Act. This bipartisan legislation will expand the Special Immigrant Visa to Afghan allies that stood shoulder to shoulder with our troops during the Afghan War.

To date, there are three proposed bills relating to veterans that have been introduced and sitting with the Senate Veterans' Affairs Committee. Those bills are: SB4838, SB4841, and SB4797. For more information on these bills, you can go to https://legiscan.com/US/pending/senate-veterans-affairs-committee/id/2333. In short these bills are relating to bills for beneficiary travel, and for other purposes, improving benefits and services for surviving spouses, and designating the clinic of the Department of Veterans Affairs in Mishawaka, Indiana, as the Jackie Walorski VA Clinic.

New Units/Unit Development & Revitalization

CANCELLATION, SUSPENSION AND REVOCATION OF A CHARTER

Under the national Constitution, Unit charters may become non-operative either through cancellation, suspension or revocation.

Cancellation is in order when two or more Units merge or when a **Unit voluntarily** ceases to function.

A Unit charter may be revoked upon failure of the Unit to surrender its charter at the call of the Department President, such a call being authorized in the following cases: a Unit fails to meet the obligations imposed on it by the Constitution, Bylaws, or by ruling of convention or executive committees; a Unit ceases to function from one department Convention to the next; or a Unit refuses to pay the per capita tax due the Department and National organizations.

The Department Executive Committee may order the suspension of a charter for a period not to extend beyond the closing of the next succeeding Department Convention as a disciplinary measure of pending action relative to final revocation.

Second booster shots (fourth shot) are also now available for those over 50.

Southwest Blind Rehabilitation Center is now open and is resuming outings. Visitation at SAVAHCS is still limited. Monetary donations are being accepted at this time.

There is a new program to assist Veterans patients with food insecurities. A separate food pantry is filling this need. Thank you to Unit 132 for their generous donation to this program. Thank you to Auxiliary Unit 131 who donated \$1,000 to benefit this program. We had a lot of fun purchasing and delivering the food items.

The grand total of monetary donations for the American Legion Auxiliary for May 1, 2022 to August 31, 2022 is \$6,595.00. Thank you to Units 66 & 131 for their generous donations. Through their help, we were able to support the Wheelchair Games, the Community Gardens program and the Gathering of American Indian Veterans program.

ASVH-PHX provides nursing, therapeutic, recreation, and social services to those who have served our nation. Rehabilitative therapy is provided seven days a week. Physical therapy is designed to improve movement and function. Occupational therapy is designed to improve daily living skills, while Speech therapy is intended to improve memory and swallowing disabilities. The Namaste program is a person-centered approach to late-stage dementia care.
