"On the first day of the week, Mary of Magdala came to the tomb early in the morning, while it was still dark, and saw the stone removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, "They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him." So Peter and the other disciple went out and came to the tomb. They both ran, but the other disciple ran faster than Peter and arrived at the tomb first; he bent down and saw the burial cloths there, but did not go in. When Simon Peter arrived after him, he went into the tomb and saw the burial cloths there, and the cloth that had covered his head, not with the burial cloths but rolled up in a separate place. Then the other disciple also went in, the one who had arrived at the tomb first, and he saw and believed. For they did not yet understand the Scripture that he had to rise from the dead.

## Pastor's Study Desk Notes

Luke 24:1-12

Year C

Easter Sunday

"The women who had come from Galilee with him" (Luke 24:1)? They prepared spices and oils to caringly apply to Jesus' dead body, as a type of cleansing and embalming process in Jesus' burial. Who are they? That is a familiar phrase ('women who had come from Galilee with him') for Luke. Just before today's gospel verse, we had heard this phrase to describe the women who also followed behind when Jesus was taken down from the cross and placed in the tomb. Luke 23:55 tells us that "they had seen the tomb and the way in which his body was laid in it". Then, they went home to prepare spices and oils for the body. Luke has the <u>same women</u> at the scene of Christ's death also going along to the tomb, to ensure for history's sake that they do return to the same spot-same tomb, where Jesus was buried. They witnessed it and were there to see the exact location. This is so important, because some resurrection-deniers, claimed that the apostles were so shaken up and scattered by Jesus' death, that no one really knew the exact location of Jesus' burial spot. They claimed the women went to the wrong tomb address the next morning, so of course they didn't find his body there. But Luke details that it was the same group that saw him buried, that also returned the next morning to the same place. (Has it ever happened that someone told you, "I dropped the papers off at your office", but you never got them? Maybe it was an office they went to, but it wasn't yours!)

But who were these women disciples? They are mentioned at several places in Luke's gospel. In Luke 23:48-49, we hear that these women are among Jesus' friends who 'stood off at a distance', watching the events surrounding Jesus' death on the cross. Much earlier in Luke's gospel, these women disciples of Jesus, were described (and named) as "some women who had been cured of evil spirits and infirmities, 1) Mary, called Magdalene, from whom seven demons had gone out, 2)Joanna, the wife of Herod's steward Chuza, 3)Susanna, and <u>many others</u> who provided for them out of their resources" (Luke 8:2-3). The faithful tenderness of the women who caringly provided for Jesus throughout His ministry, is a testament to how deeply He touched and affected them. Jesus had healed or otherwise touched them through personal encounters with them, and they responded by offering compassionate service to Him and His mission. I think another example of this personal bonding and commitment between Jesus and His disciples (their willingness to serve Him) is seen in the interaction between Jesus and Peter's mother-in-law. In Luke 4:38-39, we are told that after Jesus heals her, she immediately began to wait upon Jesus (her reaction to Jesus' touch was to serve-pass grace forward!) But notice that Luke says in chapter 8:3, that "many others" were in the women's group. Certainly that would include Jesus' kinfolk, such as the Blessed Mother (she doesn't need mentioning by name-we know she would be at his side!). But again, on Easter morning, these women are the first witnesses to the empty tomb and seeing the angelic men who announced Jesus' resurrection.

I like how Luke parallels this 'announcement' scene at the tomb with angel-heralds announcing Jesus' resurrection at the end of the gospel, similar to when Luke began the gospel with angelic heralds also announcing Jesus' 1<sup>st</sup> coming(*birth*) into the world (Lk 2:10-13)!

But, Good news comes to those doing good! These women respond to cruelty with kindness. They are compensating for the terrible brutality of Jesus' crucifixion by offer their own compassionate responses of care toward him. And as a result, they experience 'resurrection'! don't they set a great example of discipleship? Despite the harshness of the world around them, they hospitably exhibit helpful service, and receive joy/bliss as a result. They experience angels, being told the most welcome news that Jesus is in fact alive again! And they joyfully and jubilantly share the news with others. Although their joyful enthusiasm is not reciprocated by the other apostles immediately, that does not deter them from continuing to tell it! Luke tells us that some of the Twelve, (not Peter, because he did follow up to see for himself) they dismissed the women as nonsensical, passing along idle tales (Luke 24:11,22-23). But the women know! They continue to bubble over with grace to share with everyone, the 'rest of the story'. The angels had 'reminded' them (Luke 24:6 "Remember what he said....") that Jesus had predicted His rejection and execution in earlier teaching to them. And not just once, but Jesus had said as much, at least three times before to them (Luke 9:22, 44; 17:25; 18:32–33). Jesus will challenge the two disciples on the road to Emmaus, that they are 'slow at heart to believe' (Luke 24:25). Whether slow to remember, slow to learn, slow to believe, or slow to act, we can all be guilty of such missing out on God's grace. Is it our fallen human nature and our tendency to inertia, that leads us to be dismissive and small-hearted toward God's grace? It's our own joyfulness that we reject, when we discredit angelic announcements or transformative visions. How could the disciples not have believed instantly at the first suggestion of Jesus' resurrection? These women evangelists certainly had that gift of belief & hope! Jesus' Resurrection is God's resilient remedy to our negative discounting of divine action. Though we are realistic, and grant that there was doubt and denial among the first believers, there was much more hope and helpfulness in the disciples for us to affirm! Jesus rose up from the dead, and opened new life-beginnings to them! With Jesus' resurrection, God revealed that there is more ahead, than there is, behind us. Easter calls us out, to be always open to new beginnings and seeing the Great Good, even though its often minimized, there is so much Good all around us! Thank God for those women's acts of thoughtful kindness that brought us the news of Jesus overcoming our death and sin! They proved it! Peace, Fr Brian
