

POWERS & DUTIES

The City Manager reports to a progressive three-member Commission, oversees all departments and manages the day-to-day operations of the city. The city operates its own electric generating and distribution system and provides water/wastewater utilities. The City Manager is responsible for preparing the city budget, attending commission meetings, management of personnel, policy development, coordination of strategic planning and keeping the commission informed on all city matters.
