

Prominent Grange Woman Stricken

Mrs. Arthur H. (Wilhelmina Elizabeth Armbruster) Notter, 69, of Rt. 7, Box 335, Tacoma, died Thursday in a local hospital. Born in Sebawaing, Mich., she came to Tacoma in 1918 from Michigan.

In Tacoma and Pierce county, Mrs. Notter became active in Grange work and in Democratic party circles. She was a member of the James Sales Grange and the National Grange and for a time was chairman of the home economics county committee. She also was affiliated with the Pierce County Women's Democratic league, and sang with the old Tacoma Oratorio society.
