Unscientific "Precaution"

This paper thoroughly documents the European Union's long-term strategy to change how international trade rules and international law evaluate whether a domestic regulation or standard constitutes a "non-tariff barrier" to trade. Such an effort is needed, the author argues, because Europe has imposed a vast system of environment, health, and safety rules based not on sound science, but on politicized, subjective notions of hazards. In order for Europe to continue imposing these "precautionary" regulations, it thus must dramatically alter the framework of international trade rules.
