## LongShot Farm's After School Program

### What is our After School Program?

This is a work/study program that offers a chance to be a part of the LongShot Farm Team and learn about horse care, business management, and horse and rider development. You'll be able to see what goes into a National level training program and spend time with our World class horses. We have both indoor and outdoor arenas which allow us to operate year round.

The After School Program supports our academy lesson program tracts of teaching and business management, as well as horse management and development. We tackle special projects and in depth horse care, we maintain records and appointment schedules, we collaborate with our team of equine professionals, and so much more.

Our core values of teamwork, honesty, leadership, and fairness are priority. We ask each student to sign our Code of Conduct, understanding that they represent our program in the barn and out in their community.

Participation in our After School Program also prepares students for further education in our Young Horse Development Program, our Teaching Techniques Program, and Apprenticeship positions.

#### Who is invited to join?

Any youth ages 12 to 19 who is a current LSF student and/or a current Teenybopper at Mytalisha's Dream is invited to apply. A limited number of spots are available. Previous horse experience is helpful but not required.

#### How does it work?

Accepted applicants are asked to commit to a minimum of 6 participation days per month and at least 2 paid lessons per month at LongShot Farm. We work together as a team to prioritize tasks and learning opportunities. After School participation days earn the student Ride Time. Three separate 3-hour work days or shifts put the student next on the list for ride time.

Our program is small; we only take a limited number of students to ensure everyone gets ride time in a timely manner. Students who do not fulfill the requirements of the program will be asked to give up their spot for another student who is able to do so.

After School availability hours and teen group lessons are posted each Sunday evening on our private message group.
