Meet Your Executive Member

Neesha Blajberg –Social Justice Chair and Learning Services Advisory Chair

Neesha started teaching in New Westminster in 2008, first as an EFI Kindergarten/Learning Assistance teacher at Herbert Spencer and John Robson, then as a Resource Teacher at New Westminster Secondary, where she worked for several years. Previous to that she taught high school English & Social Studies in Richmond. She is now a District Learning Support teacher, and her focus is on supporting teachers with their increasingly complex caseloads and classrooms.

Having always been a union activist, Neesha currently chairs the Social Justice committee as well as the Learning Services Advisory committee, and is also a member of the Bargaining Team. With her background in Special Education, she knows how important it is to advocate for the supports that both learning support and classroom teachers need, so she has been lobbying at both the district and provincial level for the resources and inservice training that teachers have long been asking for.

Lately she has been speaking out against the proposed prevalence model that the Ministry of Education is attempting to implement without adequate consultation with teachers. She has spoken with MLAs and recently co-presented at the BCTF Metro West Zone Meeting, providing concrete examples of the possible implications of moving to such a model.

It's been a busy year, but Neesha enjoys her work advocating for teachers. She feels particularly fortunate to be able to represent her New West colleagues as an NWTU delegate at BCTF events such as zone meetings and the AGM.

On the more personal side, Neesha is the proud mother of two daughters -- 13-year-old Tess, and 9-year-old Lena -- who she is raising to feel empowered and to have a strong voice. Conscious of the need to be a positive role model for them, she tries to take a mindful approach to life's challenges, live according to her values, and make a positive difference, "I know it's not always easy, but I believe a little empathy and acceptance can go a long way!"
