Eligibility

The student must be an Illinois high school senior and have applied to or been accepted to an accredited four-year university or a two-year community, junior, or trade school/college.

Students must have a C average or greater.

Application Criteria

Applications must include ALL of the following:

Completed application form and 650-700-word essay
A certified transcript of grades from high school.

Scholarship Award

The scholarship may be paid directly to the student or the college upon receipt of enrollment verification.

Please return the scholarship application, essay, and transcripts to Rita Kreslin at the AAIM office by Monday, May 13, 2024. The scholarship recipient will be notified by Monday, May 20, 2024.
