

A Note from Pastor Toni

For the past six weeks we have been challenged to take a hard look at our own faith; it's character, its commitment it's outward expression; a faith that has confidence in what we hope for and an assurance in what we do not see. A faith that trusts God *Come Hell or High-Water* regardless of the storms we face. A faith that speaks to others of our complete and uncompromised trust in God.

The writer of Hebrews reminds us that we live by our faith not by what we see! Following Jesus can only be lived out through faith. Following Jesus is only possible *because* of faith. And a *come-hell-or-high-water* faith is the kind of faith that we need no matter what is ahead of us. We can rest in the knowledge that our God is already there! He has created us anew in Christ Jesus, <u>so we can</u> do the good things He planned for us long ago. (Eph. 2)

We are moving toward the most significant Christian celebration of the year as Jesus followers. EASTER—the Resurrection—New Life—New Hope—New Possibilities—New beginnings.

But first we enter into Lent. A season for Jesus followers to pause and discipline ourselves. A season of reflection and renewal. Lent is a season of formation and preparation. During this

season, Jesus followers set aside time to hear the call to return to God with all their hearts. Lent is a season that was historically set aside characterized by much prayer and fasting. Every year, then, this season becomes a place for us to revisit and renew our beginnings along this Christian journey of salvation; to look deep within ourselves and ask the question: How am I living as a disciple of Christ; reaching out to others and inviting them into the journey?

Lent is an opportunity to look into ourselves more deeply through the looking glass of the Holy Spirit and seek to change some behavior that is less than what Christ needs from us. It might mean for some, giving something up that is not Christ-like in nature. For others it may mean changing a certain behavior through prayer, trusting God in the change. For some it may look more like starting something new as a disciple of Jesus i.e. more time in His Word, serving in a ministry, connecting with a small group, attending worship every Sunday, or raising your giving closer to the full tithe.

Lent is a time to open the doors of our hearts a little wider and understand our Lord a little deeper, so that when Good Friday and eventually Easter comes, it's not just another day at church but an opportunity to receive the overflowing of graces God has to offer. The goal is to honestly examine your life in light of God's Word and to make a commitment to change in any areas you have not submitted to the Lord. What are you doing to deepen your relationship with the One who loves you beyond comprehension and laid down his life for you, only to take it back up and empower you with the Spirit that empowered Him?

May your Lenten season be one of challenge, commitment, and support as the church responds to the call of God– "Return to me with all your heart" (Joel 2:12). A good way to start an examination of conscience is by praying Ps. 23-24: "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts. See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."

DO invite someone to our services on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter Sunday! Because what you are inviting them to is not to a building. You are inviting them to community, to friendship, to relationship, to hope. And HOPE does not disappoint!

We learned many skills and opportunities available to our county. Our next big event is the annual summit retreat at the saddle back church in lake Forrest California. The dates are Aug 6th to the 10th and we would fly down and have the three day event. This will cost us \$2,100 and know that we will have fundraising opportunities coming up as well as donation times on Sundays. We are making a wish list of things that are needing to happen to make this a success and grow. We have already worked with Rhonda to get a spot on the church website to provide more information to people. Also we will be meeting up with local churches to bring awareness to others . We also will have a wish list printed at our table if anyone is interested in what we could need in the future to keep taking steps forward. People have reached out to us to provide childcare and celebrate recovery does not like the sound of it being a "babysitting atmosphere". So as we continue to grow and move forward, Celebration Place will be added on Friday nights as we get volunteers. Please keep us in your prayers as we continue to grow and make efforts to make changes. As we close out and work on these next couple months let's remember one thing that john and I learned at the conference is that Church is the hotel for the healthy and Hospital for the sick and celebrate recovery will become a room in that hospital to help heal the ones who are hurting. 



Cristina Alger's "The Bankers Wife" features three very strong female characters that make the novel work. And it is these three women who uncover a vast money laundering scheme created by the Swiss United bank to hide the cash behind mobsters, fraudsters, terrorists and the Bashir Assad family of Syria.

The women are Annabel, the wife of Matthew a Swiss United banker who dies mysteriously in a plane crash; Marina, the fiancé of Grant the son of a New York real estate developer who is running for president and Zoe, Matthew's assistant who collects documents outlining Swiss United's scheme. Marina worked previously as an investigative reporter whose boss dies in a presumed robbery gone bad in Connecticut.

Alger interlaces her plot by going back and forth between the three women who are all working independently to find out the extent of Swiss United's nefarious deeds. Of course, Annabel is highly interested in how and why her husband died and she puts to good use her art curator skills in examining evidence.

There is a fast-paced conclusion, with a few people dying along the way, as the truth is ultimately revealed!

=My Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

United Methodist delegates from around the world gathered on Feb. 23-26, 2019, to consider proposals regarding the marriage and ordination of LGBTQ persons. Historically, our denomination has not allowed either. But, in recent years, a growing number of pastors have performed same-gender marriages and many LGBTQ persons have been ordained, in spite of "official" United Methodist policy. This has created a growing rift between "traditionalists," who wish to maintain our policies and desire more accountability, and "progressives," who believe the United Methodist Church should allow for the marriage and ordination of LGBTQ persons and are willing to challenge the status quo by breaking the rules.

The purpose of this gathering was to seek a way forward, that traditionalists and progressives could accept. In the end, our current policies to *not* marry or ordain LGBTQ persons was preserved, as well as raising the bar for accountability. I should note that 438 delegates voted in favor of maintaining our current policies and adding higher accountability, and 384 voted against. Obviously, we are still deeply divided.

What does this mean for Yreka United Methodist Church? I am deeply sorrowful about the pain this decision has inflicted on so many of my colleagues and my LGBTQ friends within and beyond our congregation. They and their families have always been included and welcomed in worship, in serving, in leadership, in joining, and in all other areas of participation. This policy in NO WAY changes our conviction that ALL people have sacred worth in the eyes of God; that ALL people need love and acceptance and that ALL people need JESUS! We still LOVE FIRST!

We are an amazing body of believers connected through our faith, our commitment to do the work of the Gospel in our community, our love for one another and our passion for Jesus Christ! We continue to be the CHURCH— a diverse gathering of imperfect people who love Jesus and one another, and are ALL saved only by God's generous grace.

I'm sad for our own members, who are hurt and wondering if there is a place for them here. I'm sad for the terrible rift that is running down the middle of our denomination and tearing it apart. I'm devastated for those who now feel excluded.

It now appears that The General Conference of the United Methodist Church has made a formal, firm and final decision, and while that decision was fairly made by a majority- who sincerely and prayerfully believe that this decision is biblical and right—I'm painfully aware of how this decision makes many LGBTQ people and their families, friends and allies feel unwanted, shunned, excluded, and unfairly singled-out.

The United Methodist Church I serve has always believed in open doors, open hearts, and open minds. We have always embraced ALL people as people of sacred worth. Because of this final vote many do not feel like they have sacred worth in the eyes of the United Methodist Church. That makes me very sad. So, let us be sensitive toward one another as we move forward. Please be gracious to those who have a different opinion from you.

On Sunday, March 10, after worship I will show the video made by the Western Jurisdiction Bishops to encourage, support and comfort those in our churches deeply affected by this decision at General Conference. They recognize the pain inflicted on so many of our brothers and sisters and stand united in support and love to all. I encourage you to stay and view it as well as join in the discussion following the video. There will be clear guidelines established for holy conferencing as we share together in a spirit of authentic caring and the commitment to love one another.


