CCA Magnet School Meeting Rescheduled to March 13

No, you haven't missed it. The Amana Elementary Magnet STEAM meeting has been postponed until Thursday, March 13. All families, in and outside of the CCA School District, are welcome to come and see what's happening at the Amana Elementary School in Middle Amana.

Yes, you can join the CC-Amana staff for an inside look at how the STEAM (stands for science, technology, arts, math) curriculum and Project Lead the WAY works and how kids interact and learn at Amana. The event will be held March 13 from 6 to 7:30 p.m. at the Amana Elementary School. Originally planned for February 13, the windy, snowy weather that day, prompted the move to March 13.

There will be building tours, hands on STEAM demonstrations and help for those who wish to ask about or initiate open enrollment into the Amana Elementary School or indicate to the CCA staff that they wish their CCA student to attend Amana Elementary.

What's happening at Amana Elementary? It has become CCA's "magnet school" offering a "major emphasis" on "innovative and hands-on learning," according to the Amana Magnet School page on the CCA website. This includes Spanish language teaching for elementary students, engineering technology, the practical application of science, plus a fine arts emphasis including the exploration of drawing, painting, vocal and instrumental music and theatre. Math and science follow the state standards, but with "additional rigor" to connect to real world applications and project-based activities. Right now this program serves kindergarten, but will be expanded to first and second grades in the 2025-26 school year.

The deadline to turn in your grant application and corresponding permit application for the upcoming review cycle is March 1, 2025. The intent of the program is to encourage and assist in funding the appropriate restoration of historic properties within the Land Use District.
