



The Bible says that God is LOVE. This desirable thought, followed by action, comes from God Himself.

There is love between humans and humans, humans and animals, and even humans and plants, but the love of humans for inanimate things like possessions and food

is not a God-created love.





Just like the blue hearts on the cover, love grows in strength and intensity. When we have a new relationship we begin cautiously. Perhaps we have been let down in the past or we just want to weigh things up. Even a new relationship with an animal is like this.

But as trust grows, so does a relationship.
Perhaps when you are young you are ready to trust right away, but older people will tell you to take it slowly because they have often had bad experiences.

God is quite different. He just loves us, whether we have let Him down or not. So many people think that God is angry and will punish every little mistake we make, so they do not even want to know Him. There is another amazing fact about God's love. He wants to pour His love into our hearts. The Bible says - God has poured out His love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom He has given us. (Romans 5:5) The reason He wants to do this is that He has chosen to demonstrate His love for us through sending His own Son, Jesus, to die for the ungodly, sinners. While we were still sinners, Christ died for us. (Romans 5:8)

The mushy stuff we see in movies and sit-coms is not the love that God loves. The Bible actually calls it lust and this so-called love is destructive. It is impatient, not kind but selfish. It causes envy and discontentment, and inflated

egos. When others do not meet our expectations it causes anger and resentment. When someone has let us down we are glad if they get hurt – it serves them right, we say. All this behaviour might be considered entertainment but actually it is undermining our purity.

In the Bible Paul has some very good advice. Whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, is excellent or praiseworthy - think about such into practice. And the God of peace will be with you. (Philippians 4:8&9)

It is very simple to receive God's love, because Jesus has already made the way. The Lord is Lord of all and richly blesses all who call on Him, for everyone who calls on the Name of the Lord will be saved. (Romans 10:12&13)

Calling on the Lord is opening our hearts to receive God's love in a personal way.

The Bible says — He (God) is wooing you from the jaws of distress to a spacious place free from restriction, to the comfort of your table laden with choice food. (Job 36:16) And Jesus adds — man does not live by bread alone but on every word that comes from the mouth of God. (Matthew 4:4)
